A Typical American High School



PIKEVILLE HIGH SCHOOL was founded by Mr. Rush Deskins and Mr. Jennie Elliott, the years of 1911-1914. Mr. J. J. Kendrick served as Superintendent from 1921-1923. Mr. John Shaw and Mr. W. M. Wesley served as principals of the high school prior to 1923, the new era began in 1923 with superintendent Mr. T. W. Oliver. In 1927 a new elementary school building was erected and also a dormitory for girls, Wright Hall. In 1947 the old wooden gymnasium burned and was replaced in 1949 by one of the finest fire proof gymnasiums in Eastern Kentucky. Its seating capacity is about 3,000. In the same year Mr. Oliver, who served as superintendent for twenty-six years died and Mr. Long became administrator for approximately 8 months. Mr. John M. York formally of Cattlesburg became superintendent. Mr. Bernard Mims is the present Principal of the High School. Both the high school and gymnasium are centers for athletics and educational functions in this area.

There are three fields of education available to the students of Pikeville High School: college preparatory, commercial and general.

Pikeville High School has always ranked high in the field of secondary education according to statements sent out by our state colleges and universities.

The team has had a good record the last three years with 24 wins, 10 losses, 1 tie, a victory in the first Big Sandy Valley Bowl, and the first team from Eastern Kentucky to play in the Shrine Bowl at Lexington. His boys have received area and State honors and Clayton has been a candidate for Kentucky Coach of the Year. Track and assistant basketball coach are two of his coaching duties.
