Does Pikeville Have Its Best Team This Year? John Bill Not Sure

Is this year's Pikeville High team, which currently is unbeaten in 9 games and rated third in Kentucky, the best one in the school's history, or at least in the last 15 years?

That's the question we popped to Coach John Bill Trivette yesterday, and since he's been coaching at PHS for 13 years, he should be the one to know.

But, as expected, he was non-committal. He said it was "too early to tell yet. We have a lot of tough games ahead of us, and I'll be able to tell more about it then."

Certainly this year's team must rate as the best in the area right now, and if the Panthers should win their District and regionals and go on to the state and even win it, then naturally, it would have to go down as the best in PHS history . . .

But the tournaments are a long way off, and although the season is almost half over, much can still happen to the Panthers, and all other area teams, for that matter.

Just last week, for instance, Buddy Elkins, a regular for the past two years, was injured, and Coach Trivette reports he has a "broken bone" in his ankle.

Now, Elkins isn't a scoring star or anything sensational, but he is a terrific defensive player, and with him around, John Bill always had one boy sitting on the bench who was as good as some of the starters and ready to take over at any time . . .

With Elkins out, Foster Coleman, a Junior, will have to take over the subbing duties. After that, it's hard telling who Trivette will use.

"I've certainly had taller boys than any on this year's team," Trivette said, "and I've had better boys individually, but as a team, this one is pretty darned good, although, as I've said before they'll have to prove themselves in the tournaments, and against some of the tougher teams."

His tallest boy is Darwin Smith at 6'2½" high, and this certainly isn't any great height as modern day basketball goes. And certainly none of this year's boys rate up to such former PHS greats as Dickie Prater, Woodie Preston and John Lee Butcher, to name just a few.

But Smith, Tommie Adkins, H. L. Justice, Larry Phillips, Howard Lockhart and Elkins are all fine ball players, with just about equal ability, and this could make for a better team, since any of them are capable of scoring plenty of points at any time . . .

Adkins has been the leading scorer to date, with 196 points in the first nine games for a 21.8 average. Lockhart is second with an average of 17.8 points per.

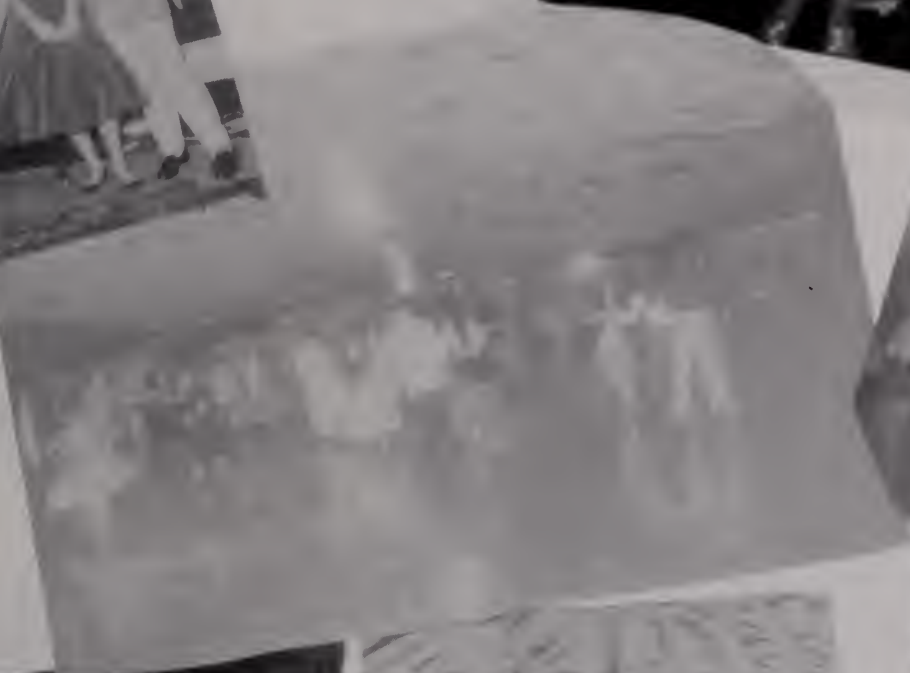
Lockhart is probably the best all-around player on the team, with his cool, collective way of playing; Smith is a fine rebounder and capable scorer; Phillips is a terrific floor man; Justice is a fine shot and good rebounder; Adkins a terrific shot, and Elkins a good defensive player.

Whether or not these boys will come close to the great overall 32-2 record of the 1948-49 team or the 30-3 mark of the 53-54 squad remains to be seen, but one thing is for sure, Pikeville has never won the state tourney, and if this year's team can pull the trick, then they would have to be rated tops in PHS history.

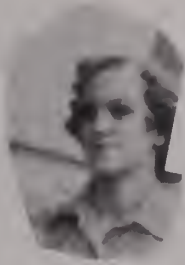
However, tourney time is a long way off, and Trivette or none of his players are counting their chickens before they're hatched, but there is no denying that a team with nine straight wins against good competition, with a scoring average of 82.7 points per game and a defensive mark of 61.1 per tilt, and one which is ranked third in a great basketball playing state like Kentucky, must have something more than a prayer.

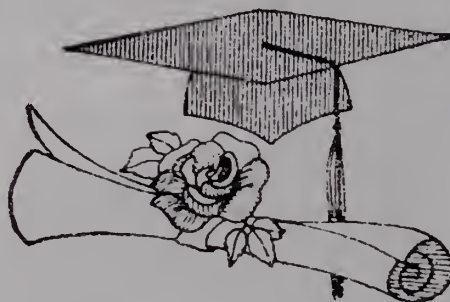

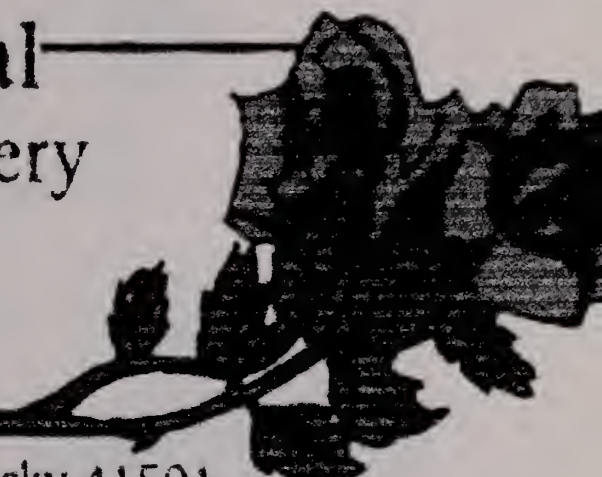
