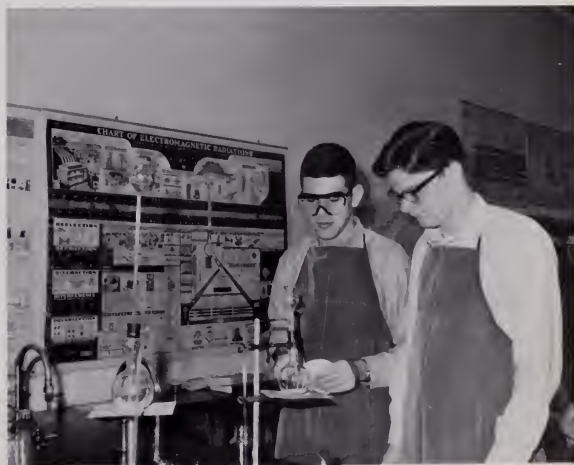

Graduating Panthers

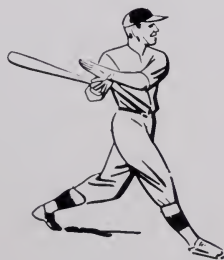
