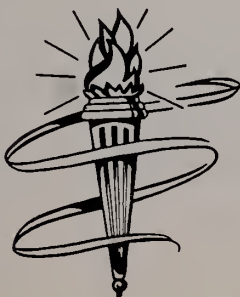
Co-Ed-Y
