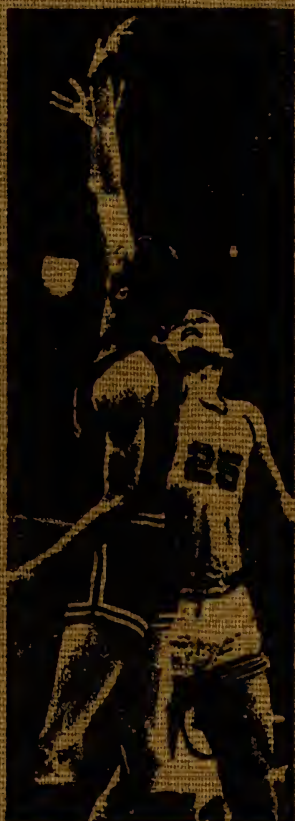
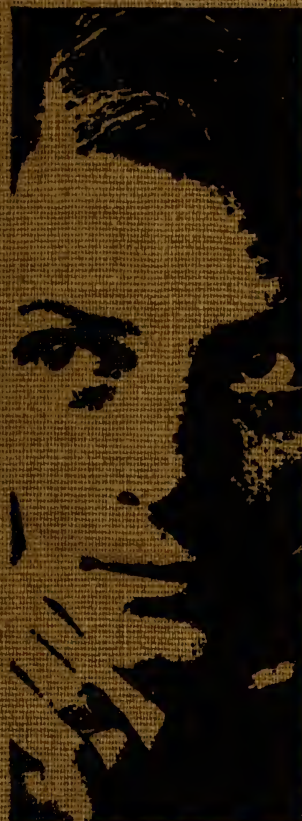

"Looking through the 1960 Panther Annual on page 106, I found 137 scraggle toothed children that now compose our graduating class. Of course over the years we've lost as well as gained classmates. We've laughed as well as cried. We've won and lost. For a while I'd like to reminisce these moments, from a different sort of view — that of a graduate.

We're the same class that cried out for an elementary school while we were in 3rd grade. We're the class who played games — skipping rope and playing marbles mostly — on the Training School playground. We're the class that proudly marched across the auditorium stage 8th grade achievement day, bursting with pride in the fact that high school awaited us.

High school . . . we tripped in the door as greenhorns and spent every Friday folk dancing under the instructions of Mr. Sowards and Mr. Butcher. The boys came to the girls' shoulders and the girls wore skirts down to their kneecaps. At any rate, we combined our talents to produce our first and last prize-winning Homecoming float.

Our sophomore year saw the birth of the Student Council as well as classmates let loose to drive on the open highways.

On July 31, 1969 a tragic event occurred. Many of us watched from the railroad tracks the pitiful sight as the gym burned. Some tearfully joked that Prom theme would have to be "Under the Starlit Sky."

Nevertheless, we watched, as the band made a surprising comeback. The School Board generously gave money for music and instrument replacement. As a result, this past year our band, composed of over 90 members, received superior ratings in both marching and playing festivals. The topping was the marching in the Pegasus Parade.

These past two years have been too good to be true. We were really upperclassmen! How could we forget the first day we sat in those priceless Senior Chairs — or sang our song, or got our rings? At last we had top lockers and got to leave assemblies first! Homecoming, Varsity, Prom . . . these all hold individual memories.

Sports played an important role in our past . . . why we have the only undefeated girls' football team in the history of P.H.S. and we seriously thought about helping our Senior boys in the Senior-Varsity game this spring. Speaking of football, we'll never forget the last football game we played with Jenkins in the mud. It was a 36-0 victory fought in revenge of the game two years ago when we lost 63-13. Our basketball team carried on the victorious spirit and what's more, they had community involvement. We could never forget the glorious motorcade after district or the undying spirit of our Senior boys after the unfortunate incident at Johnson Central. Portions of our golf team and track team made it to state. Our baseball team, after defeating Virgie in a 13 inning game traveled to Regional to win Runner-Up Honors!

With our graduation announcements and cards, and measuring for caps and gowns, we at last realized the truth. High school is almost gone and we began to grasp the memories of these past years."

In May of 1971 the Pikeville City schools regrettably bid farewell to Mr. Ivan C. McDaniel, Elementary Principal on his retirement. A native Kentuckian, Mr. McDaniel has spent his life working in the field of public education. Having served as a former teacher, principal, and superintendent, Mr. McDaniel brought his wife and three children to Pikeville and began work with us in 1956. In his fifteen years in Pikeville, he and his family have become respected and loved citizens. Mr. McDaniel has been active in civic organizations and the First Baptist Church.

Under his able leadership and guidance, the Pikeville Elementary School progressed with such innovative programs as team teaching, non-graded classes, and the use of computers. A new elementary school was built and in 1970 the school became a member of the Southern Association of Schools.

In 1971 the school received the Governor's Award for Innovating Programs. Few realize the extra hours of dedication it has required from Mr. McDaniel to reach these goals.

Although we regret losing this fine educator, the highest tribute we can pay to "Mr. Mac" is to say, "We will miss you so much more as a heartwarming, sincere individual who has influenced so many of us to be better persons because of your examples." We wish you much happiness in the years ahead.

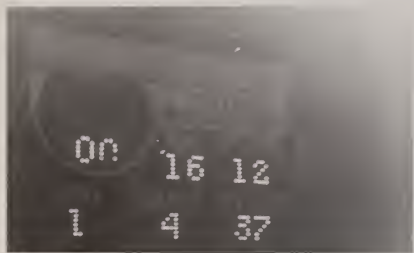

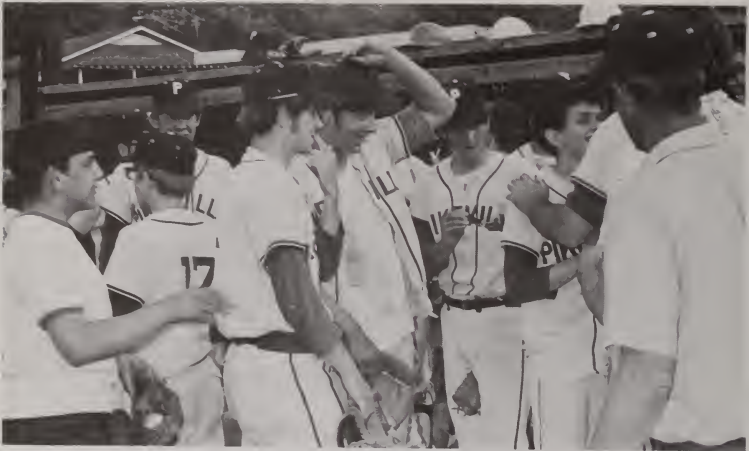

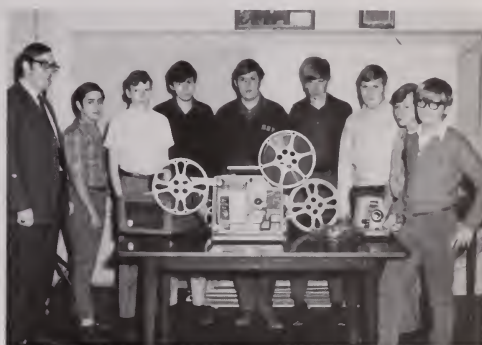
