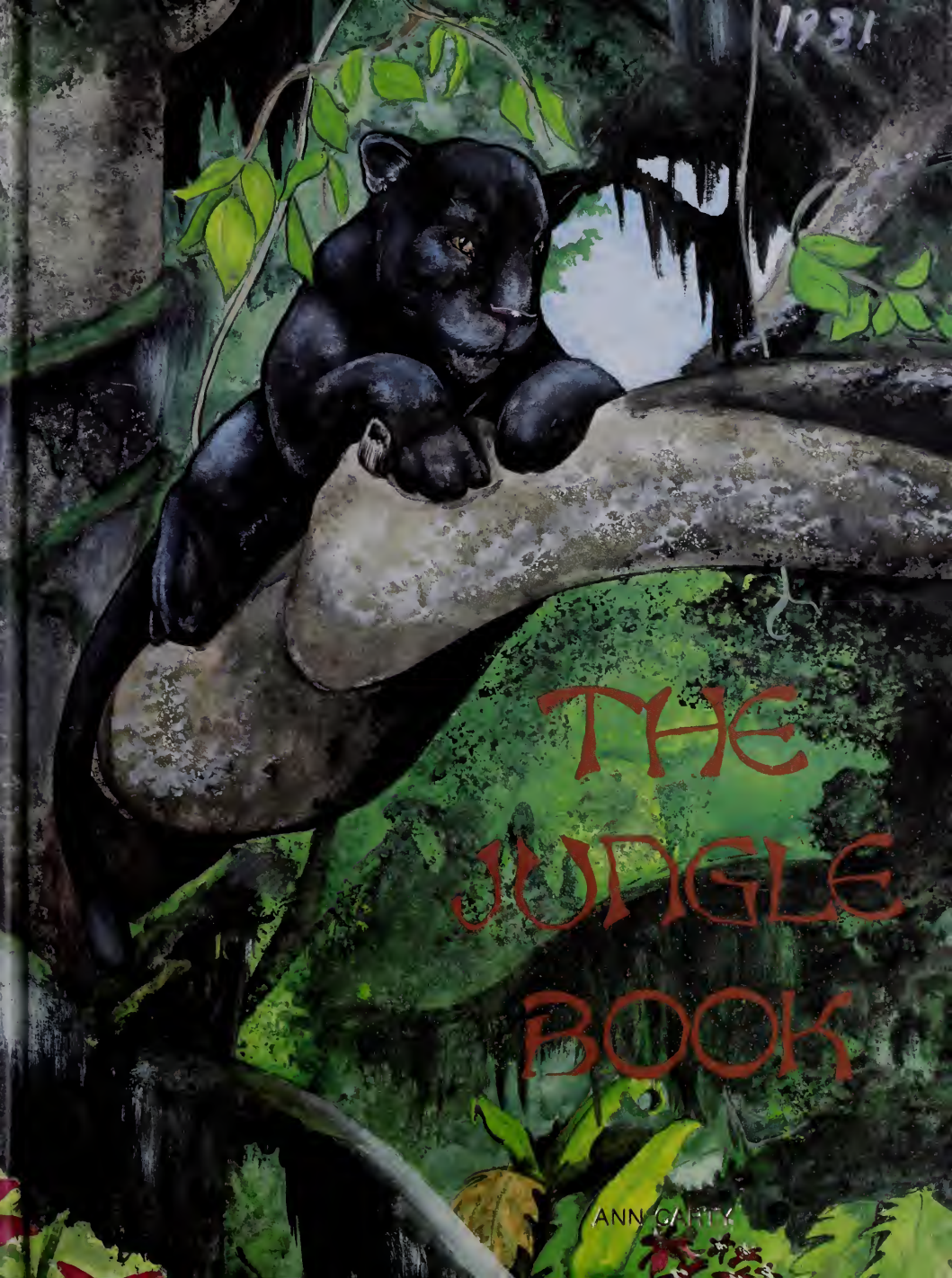



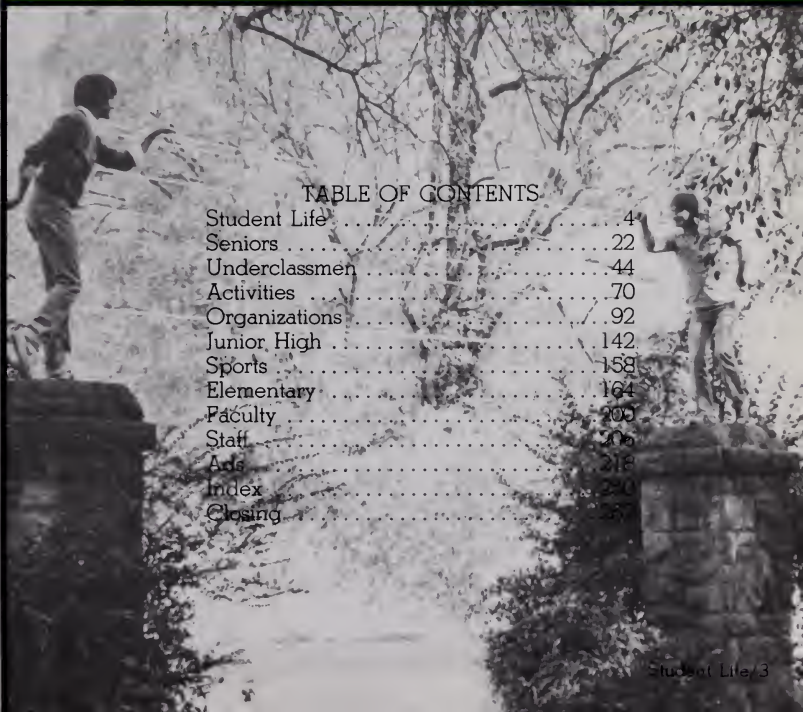

A familiar sight to many of those returning from a "wild" day at the Breaks is the slightly blurred sign "Welcome to Kentucky"

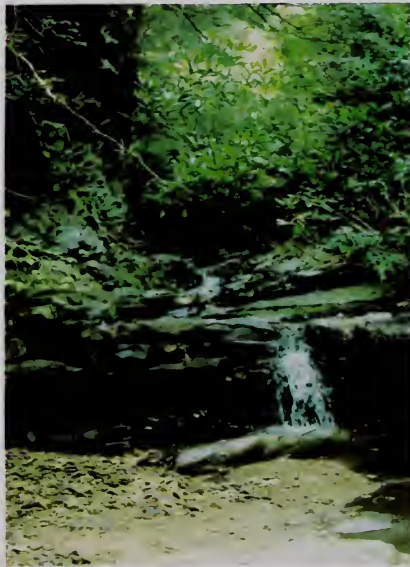

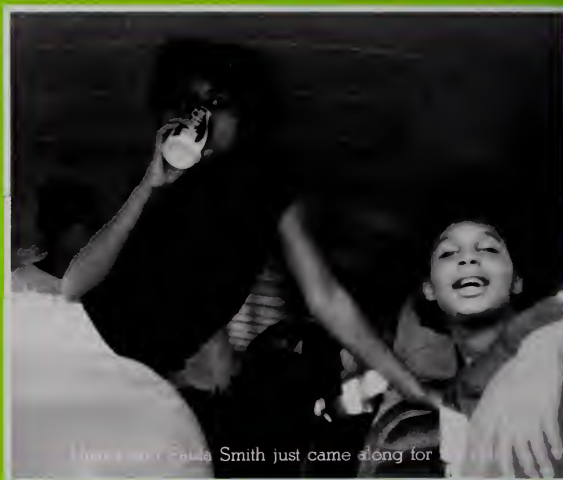

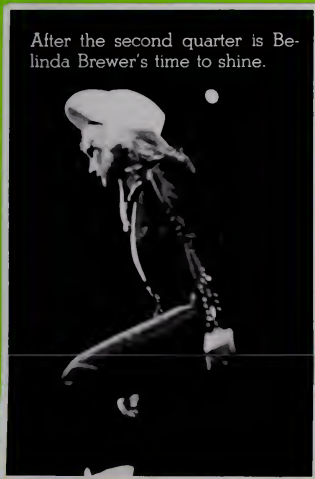

ALL WORK AND NO PLAY?

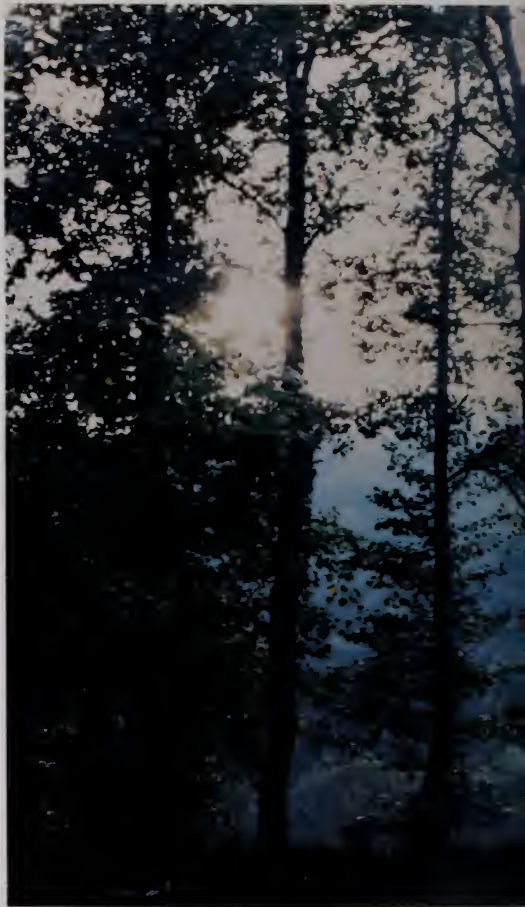

Traveling north to Granada they visited the Alhambra, a beautiful palace built by the Moors when they occupied Spain.

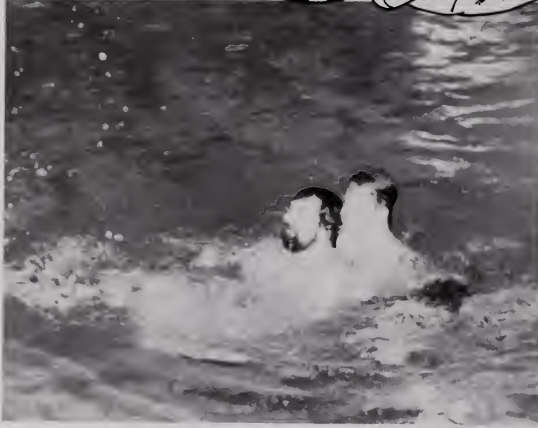
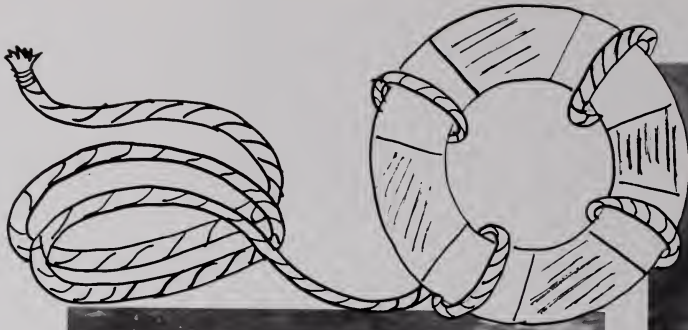
Next was Toledo, home of El Greco. Then it was on for 2 days in Madrid, the capital. There the Prado Museum occupied nearly a day for some.

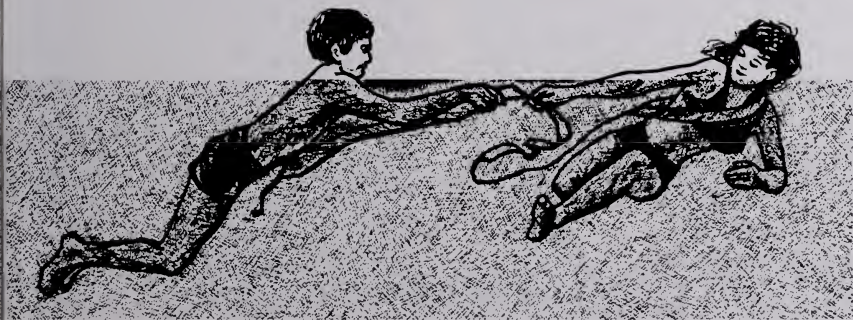

Hilde Dahlin, Pikeville's first exchange student from Oslo, Norway, is being hosted by the Carroll Cinnamonds of Park Street.

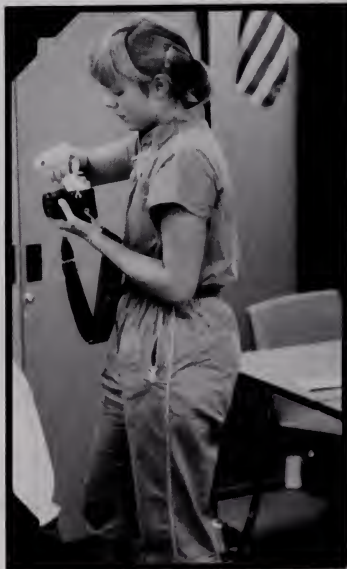

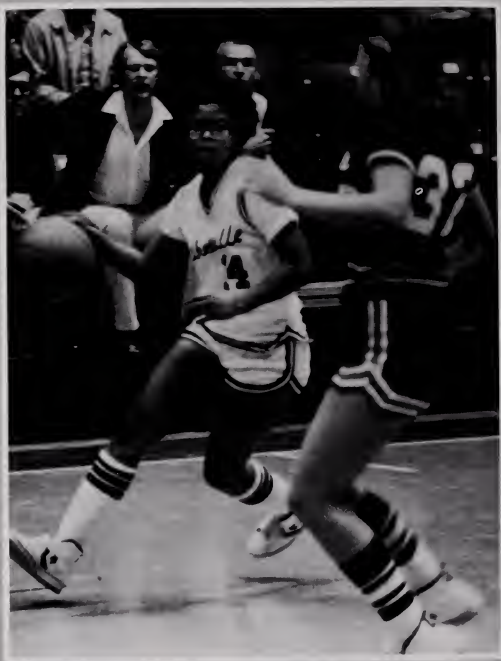

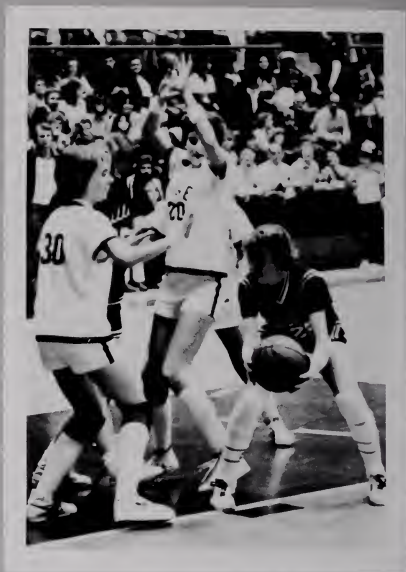

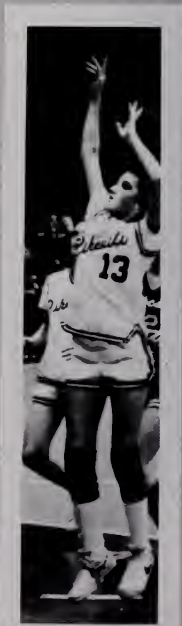

He had a very outstanding year in basketball, scoring 16 points against Millard in the district tournament and being chosen for the all tournament team.



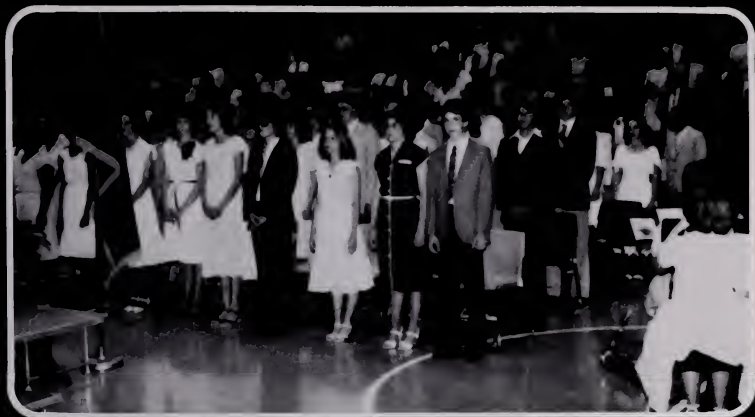
