

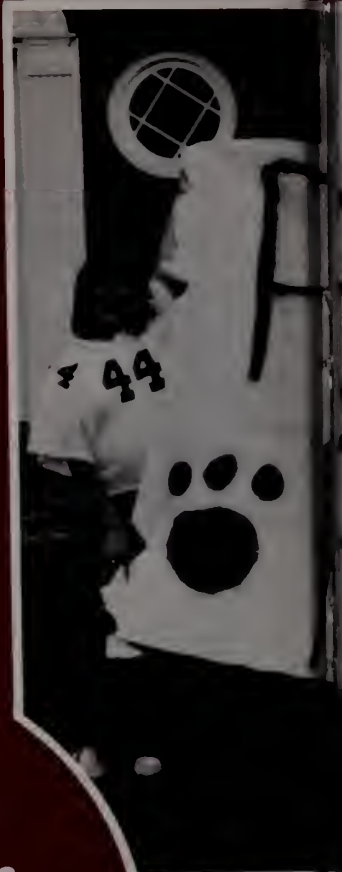

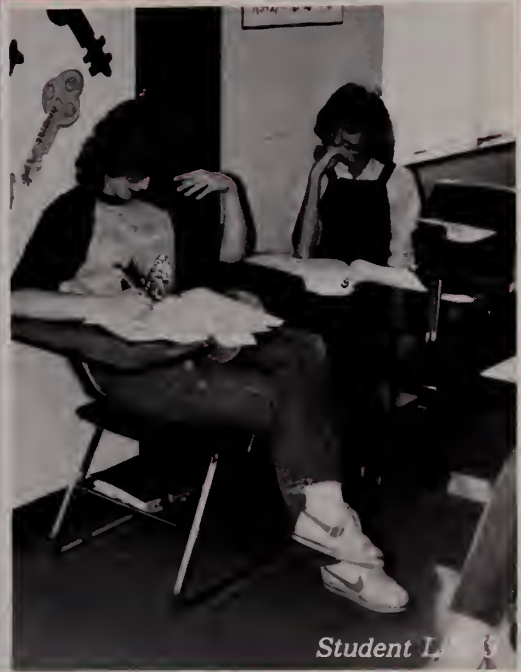
The tradition of long lunch lines, (opp. page bottom), is tolerated by Mike Gilliam, Matthew Coleman, and Richard Justice.

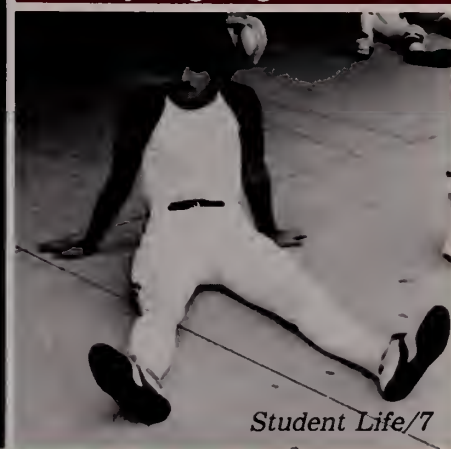

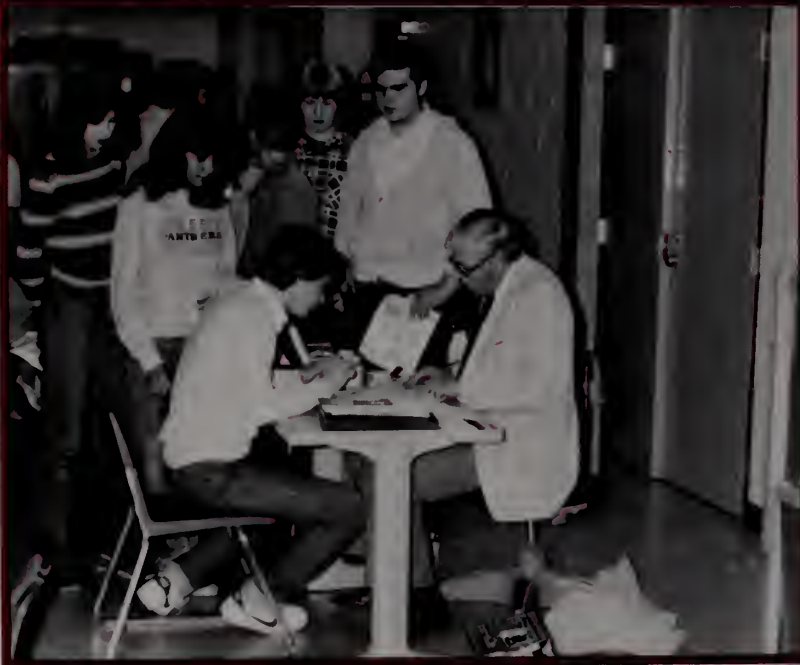

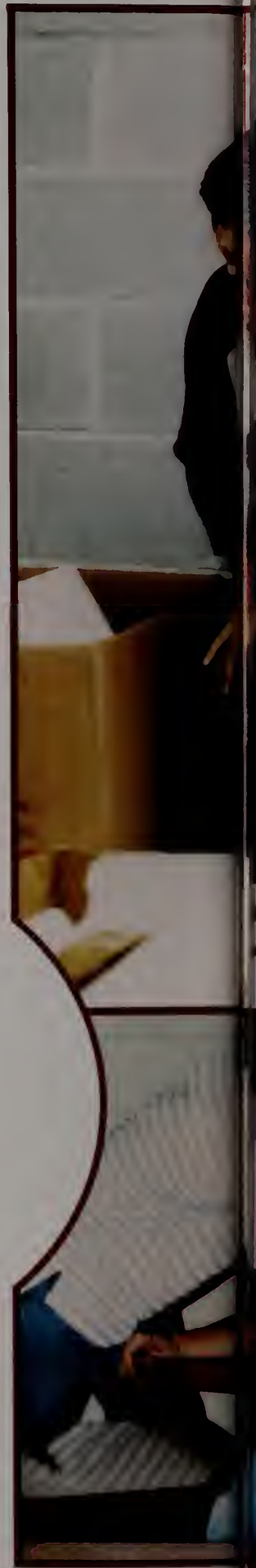
## *Behind The Scenes*

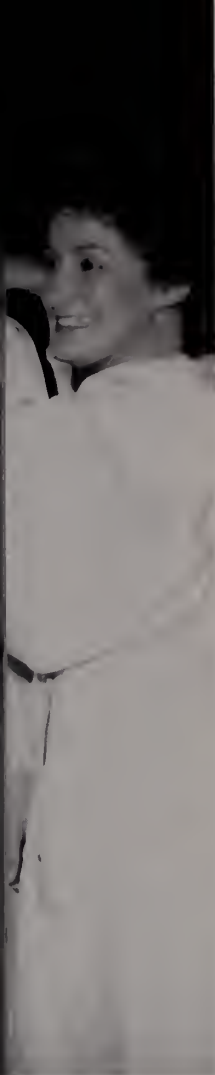

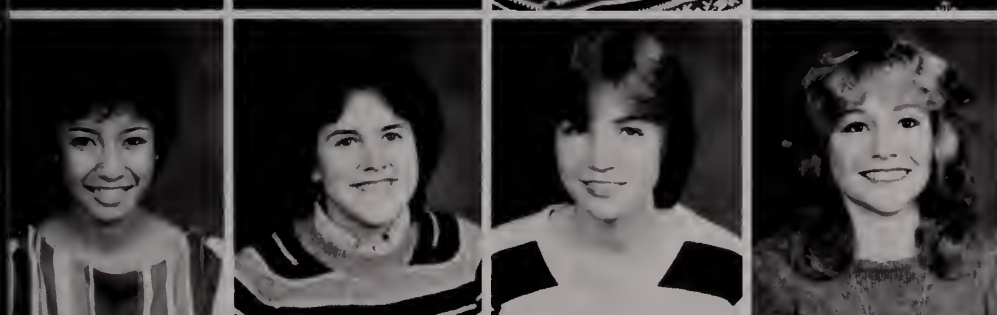

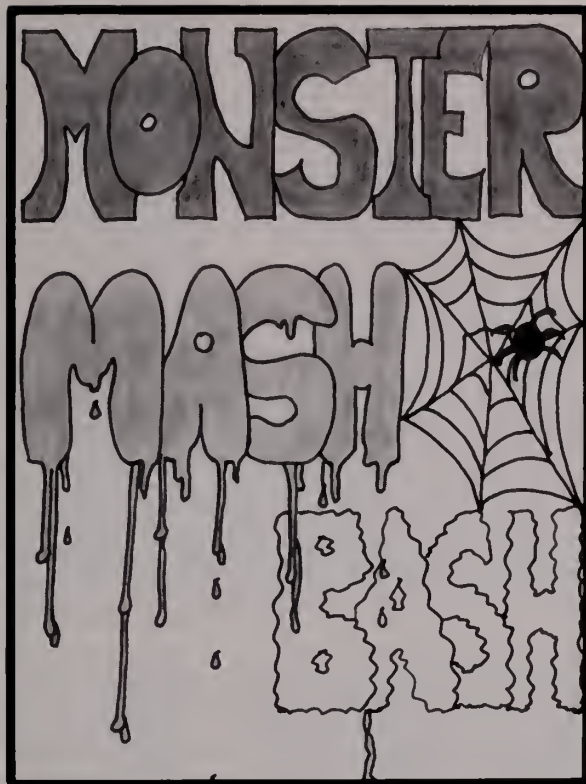

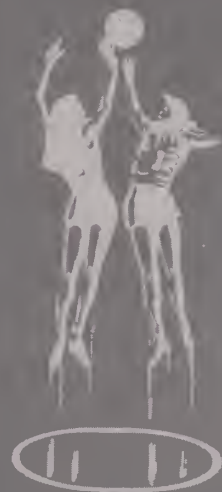

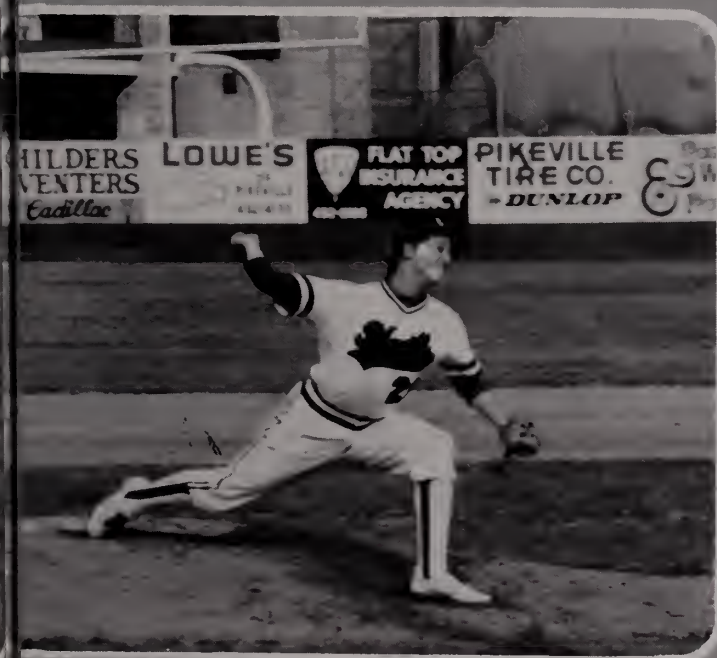

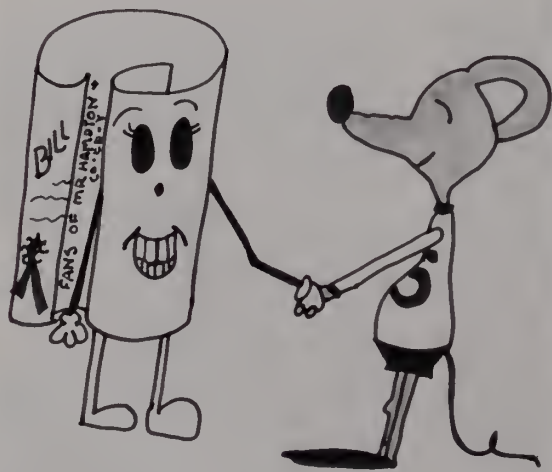

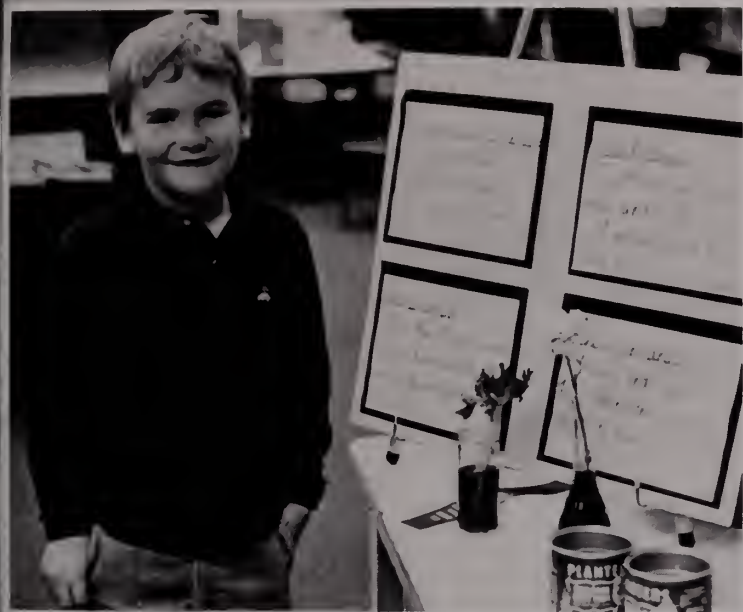


November 24th, 1982 saw a big event at the Pikeville Elementary dinatorium — the Fourth Grade Thanksgiving Program.
