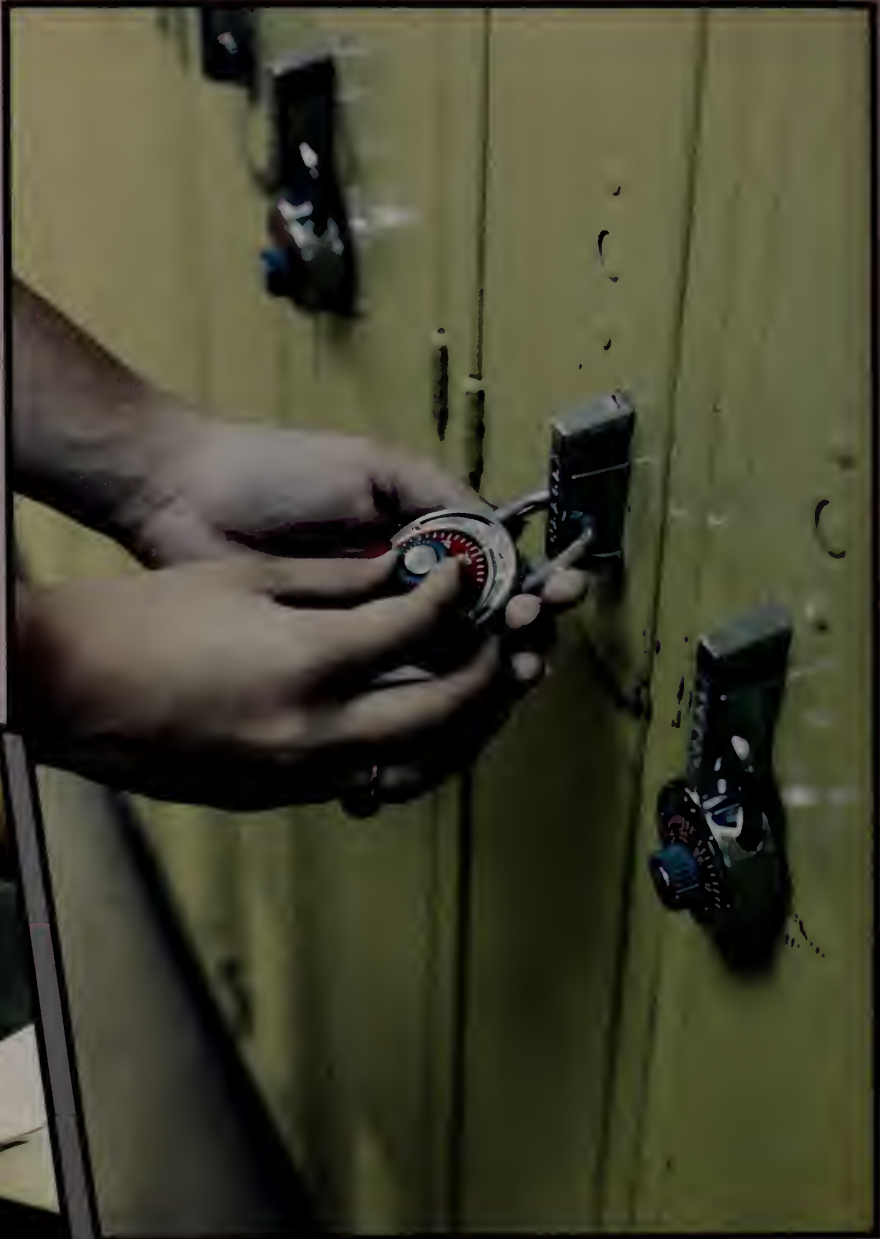

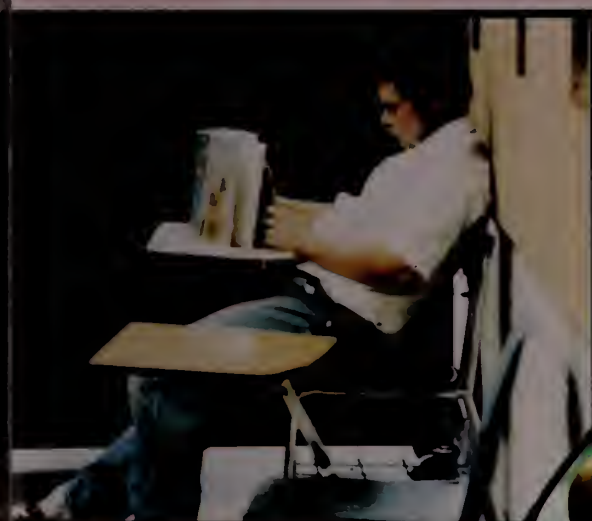

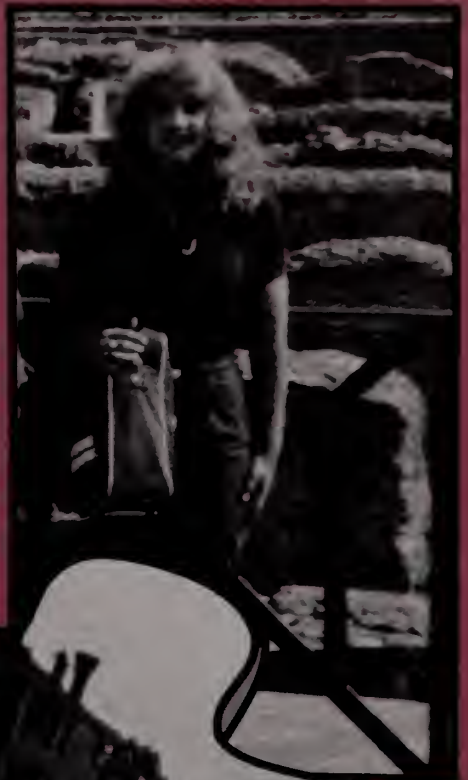
MURDER ON THE ORIENT EXPRESS

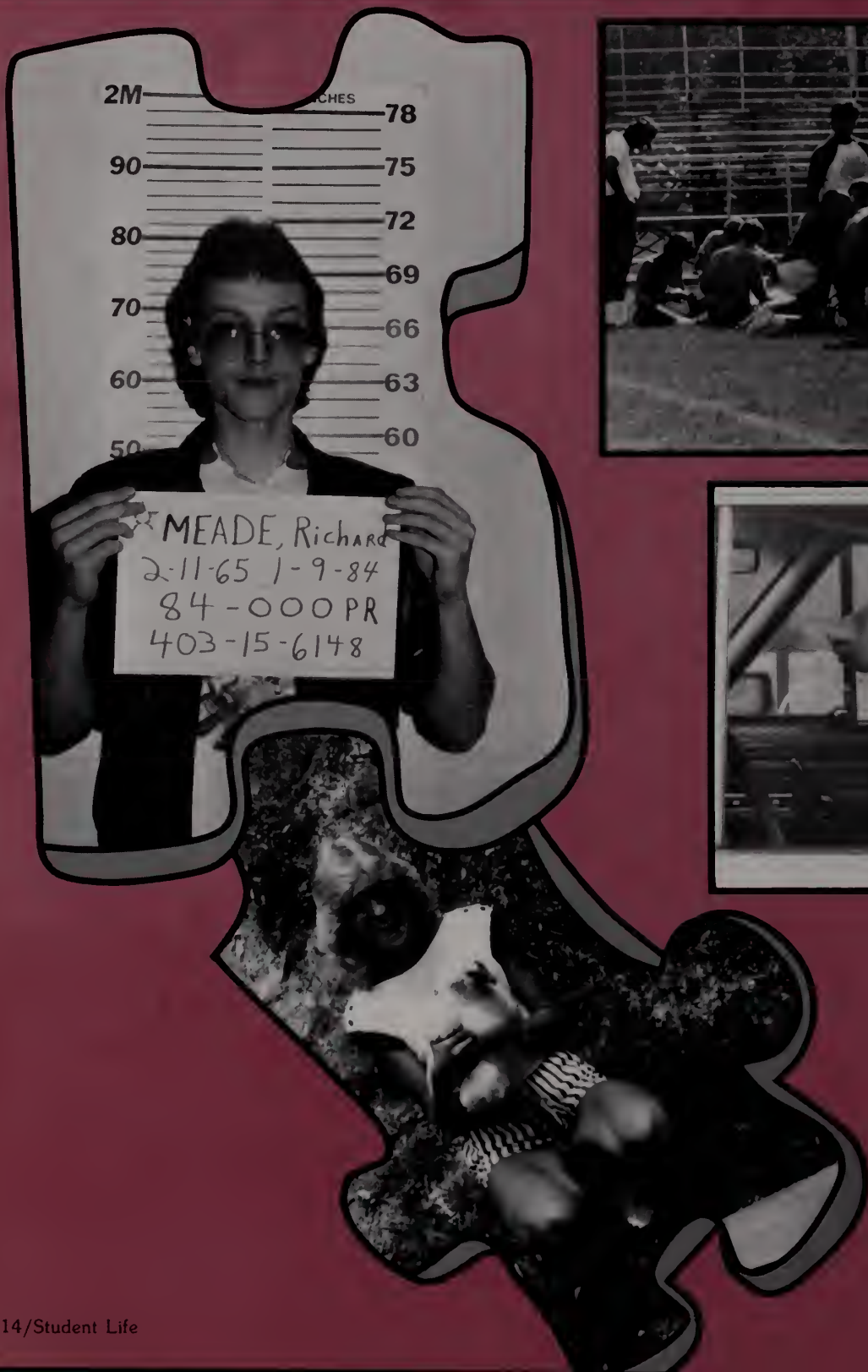

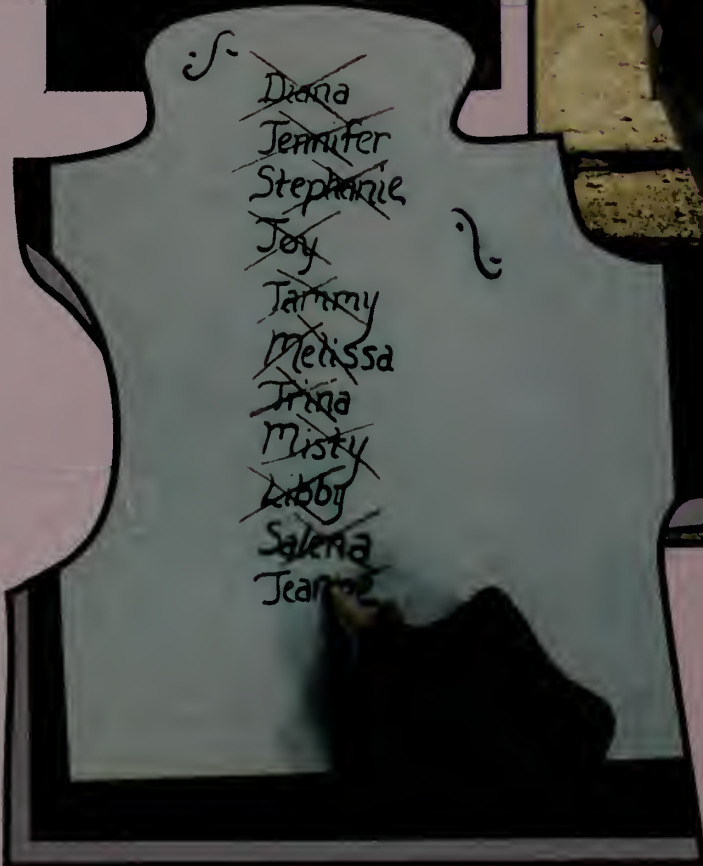
FOUL PLAY

PHS Faculty Implicated In Weight Room Scandal

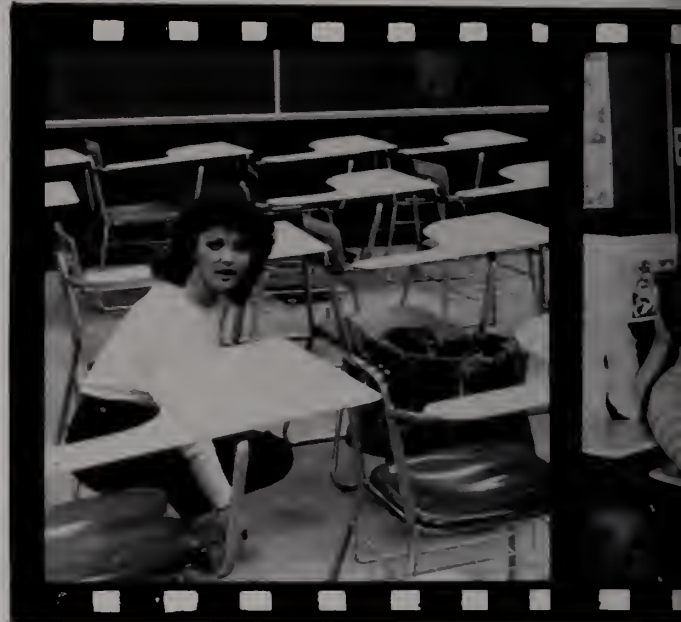

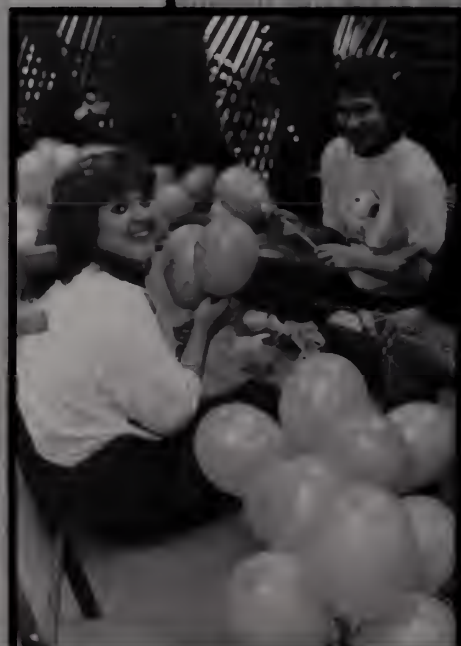

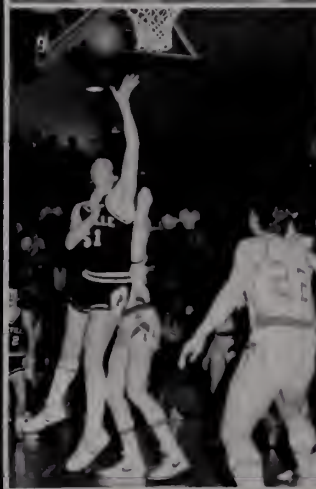

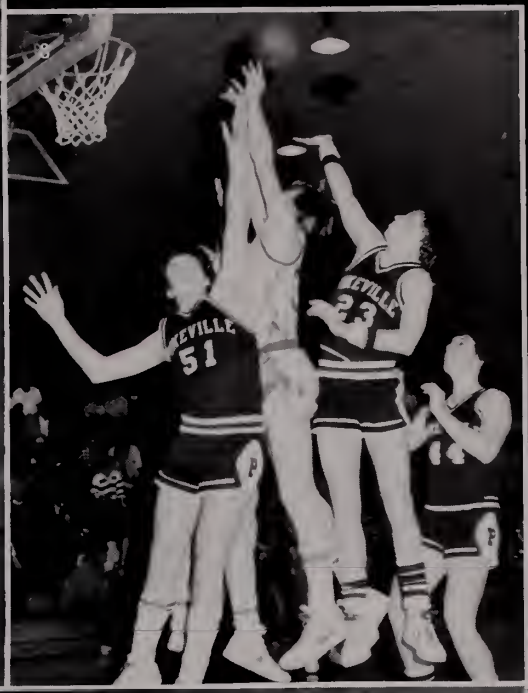

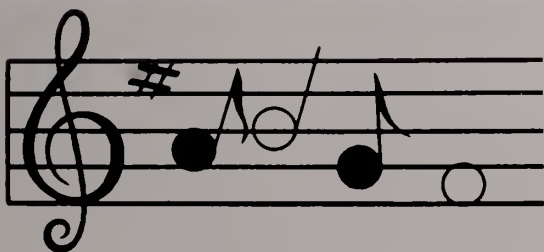
ARTFUL ILLUSIONS
