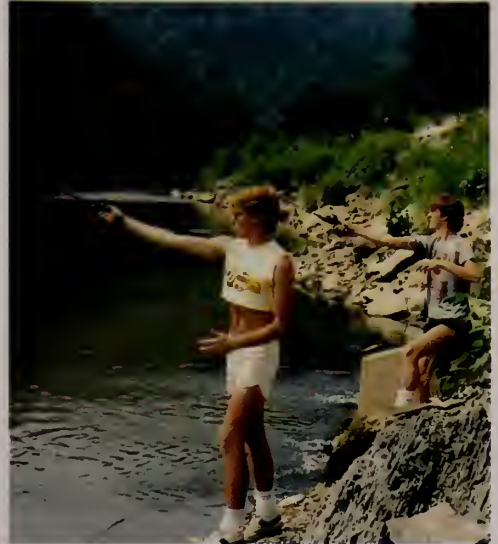
# Bloopers

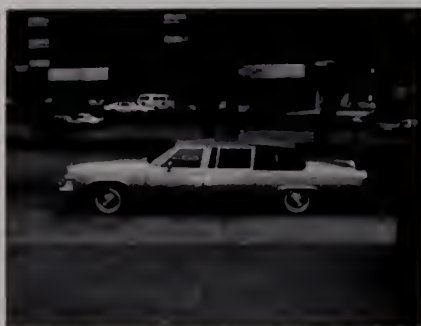
# We're Potrified

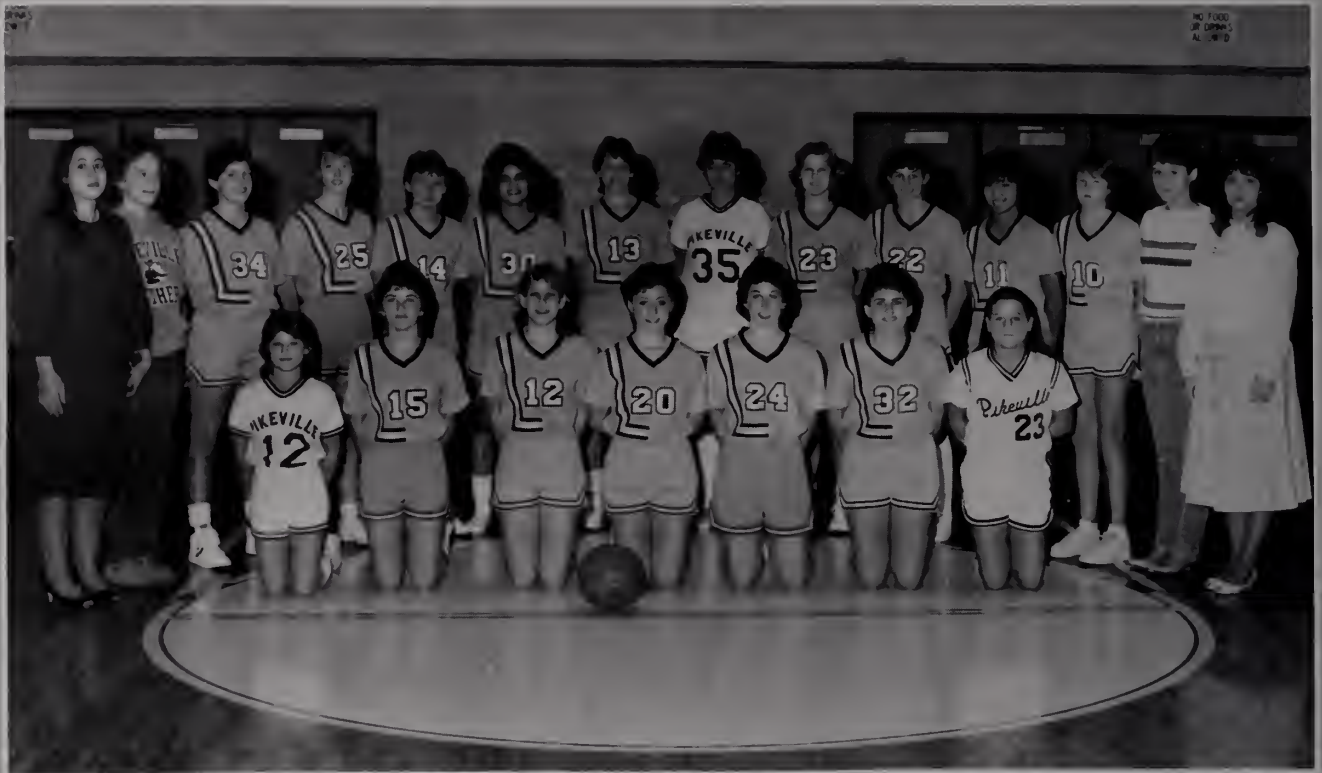

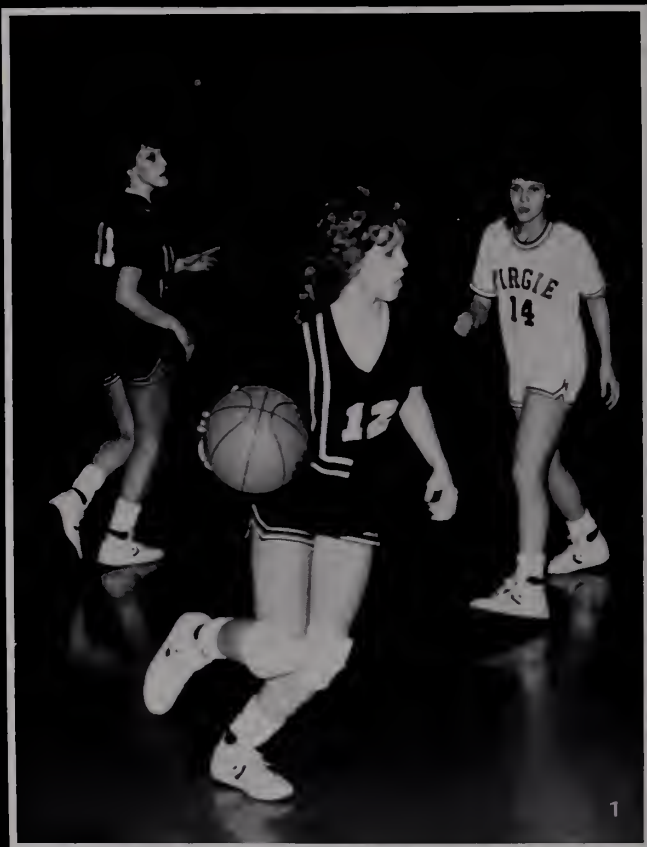

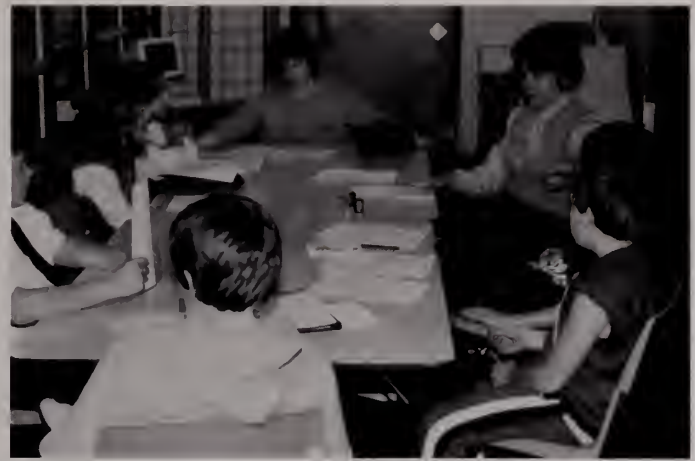
The Elementary School's Gifted and Talented Program, under the supervision of Greg Stone, entered its second year. The students enrolled in the program experienced many fun-filled activities.
