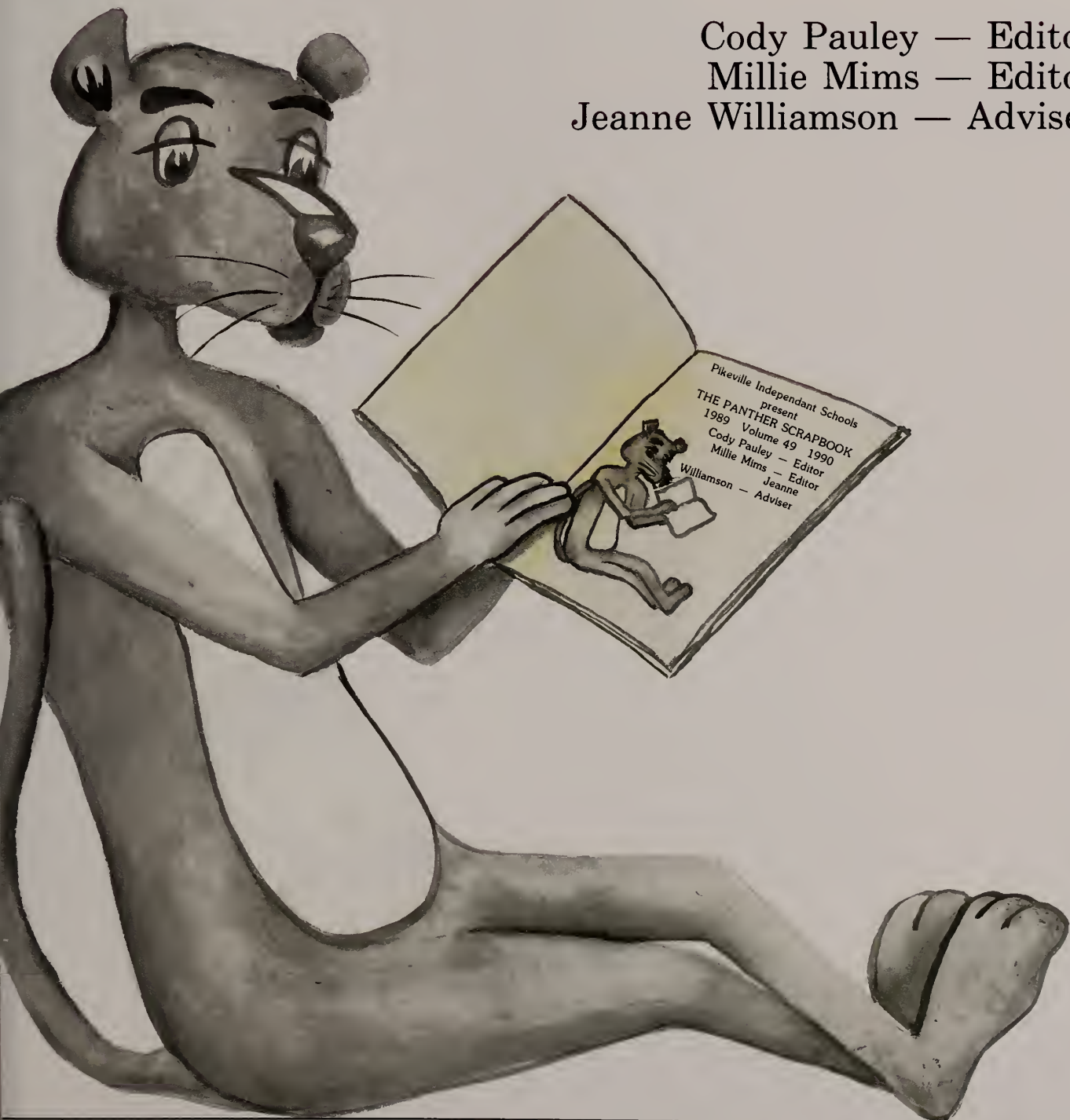

MEMORIES ARE FOREVER

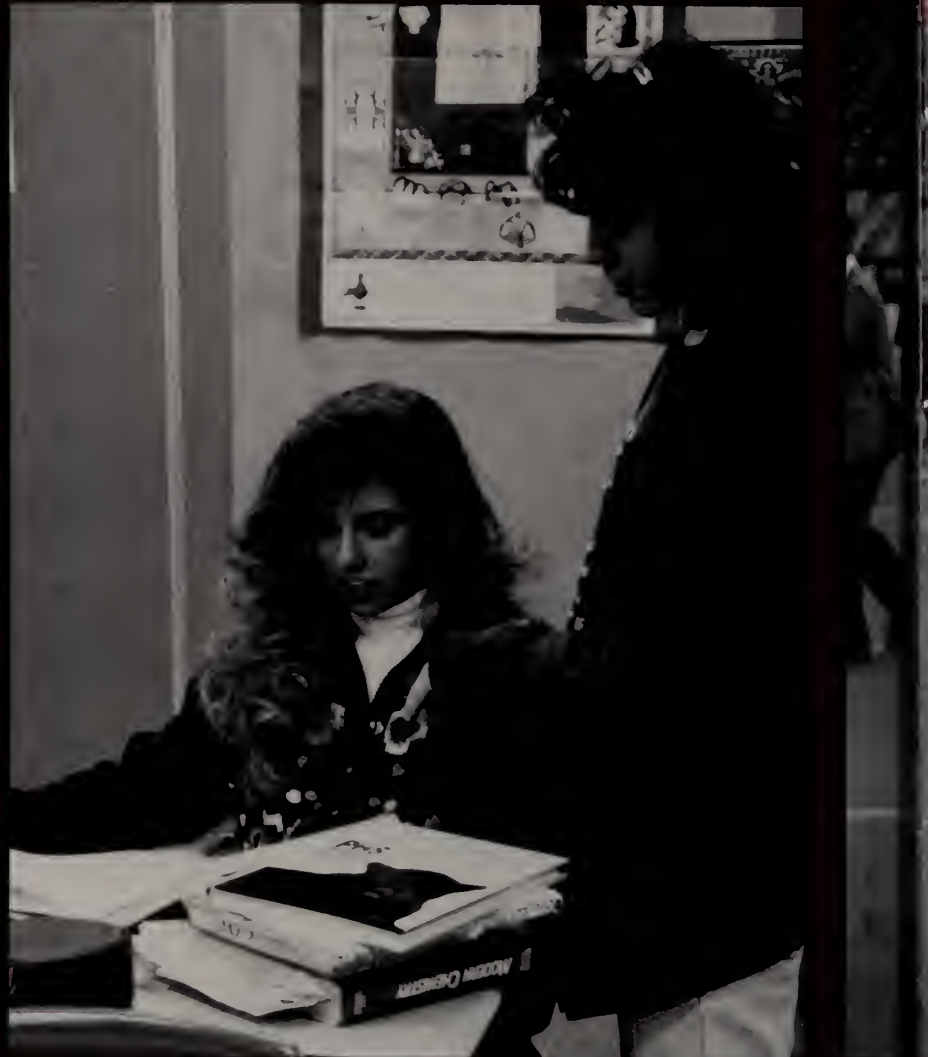

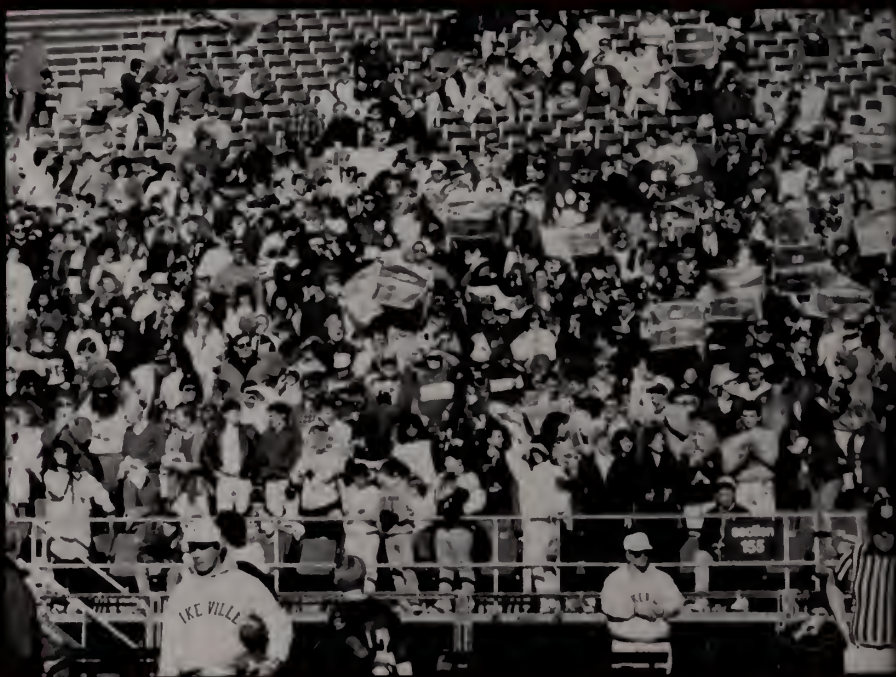

1980-1982

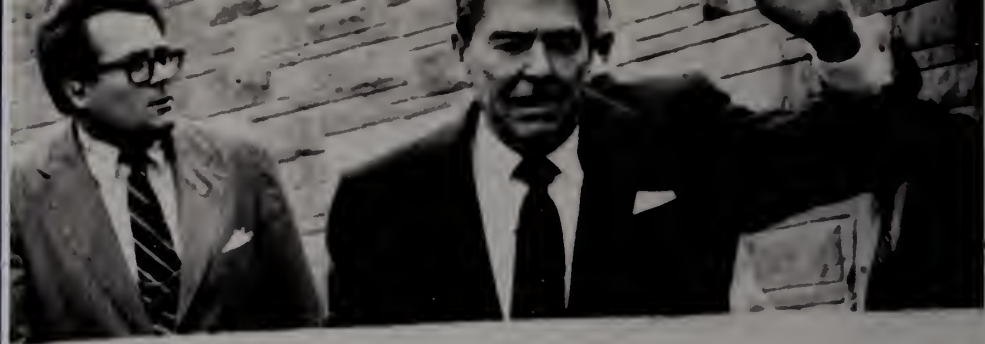
Elected to his first term in 1980, Ronald Reagan served as President of the U.S. for eight years. His administration did a lot to improve the relationship between the Soviet Union and the U.S. President Reagan's administration had a few problems, too, including the Iran-Contra Affair, the problems with Regan, and the attempted assassination of President Reagan (Right).

(Far Right) The assassin's hand can be seen as he aims from the crowd in St. Paul's Square in Rome on May 13, 1981, at Pope John Paul II as he rides through the square. Moments later the pontiff was shot. The Pope recovered from his wounds and was back at work in Vatican City within weeks.

(Below Far Right) A composite image from Saturn's system was made by Voyager I in 1980. The moon Dione is in the foreground, Saturn rising behind.

(Below Right) It was a royal bliss when Prince Charles, heir to the British throne, and Princess Diana were united in a storybook wedding in London on July 29, 1981.

Barney Clark (Below), the longest living recipient of an artificial heart, is attended to by Dr. DeVries in 1982, two days after surgeons replaced Clark's diseased heart with an artificial one.

Later, Bruce would play the same tune for recently released hostages. Tina Turner and Mick Jagger (Far Right) sang a duet at the Live Aid Concert in Philadelphia's JFK Stadium in July, 1985. Live Aid raised \$84 million for famine relief around the world. Along with Live Aid, was USA for Africa, Band Aid, and Farm Aid, which all raised money to help others in need.

Michael Jackson (Below Far Right) has thrilled fans to exhaustion and to the brink of tears. During many of his concerts, fans have passed out at the mere sight of him. Michael raises a gloved fist as he belts out a song during his Victory Tour in 1984.

During the 80's, sports were more popular than ever. There were many talented athletes who broke long-standing records.

(Below) Cincinnati Red's Pete Rose, makes hit number 4,192 in Sept., 1985 at home to break Ty Cobb's all time hitting record. In return Pete Rose not only won a place in the Hall of Fame, but also in all sports fan's hearts and memories.



Many athletes go for the gold at the Olympics, which are held every four years at a selected city around the world.

In 1980, the Summer Olympics were held in Moscow, USSR. The U.S. boycotted these games; Jimmy Carter led the boycott to protest the Soviet aggression in Afghanistan.

The 1984 Olympics produced many new faces and stars. These included gymnast Mary Lou Retton (Right Center), who was the first American woman ever to win an individual Olympic gold medal in gymnastics.

The 1988 Olympics were just as incredible as any other year. Greg Louganis, the world renowned diver, won gold medals in the springboard and platform events to add to the two gold medals he won in the 1984 games.

The games will continue to be an example of fellowship between athletes and between countries.

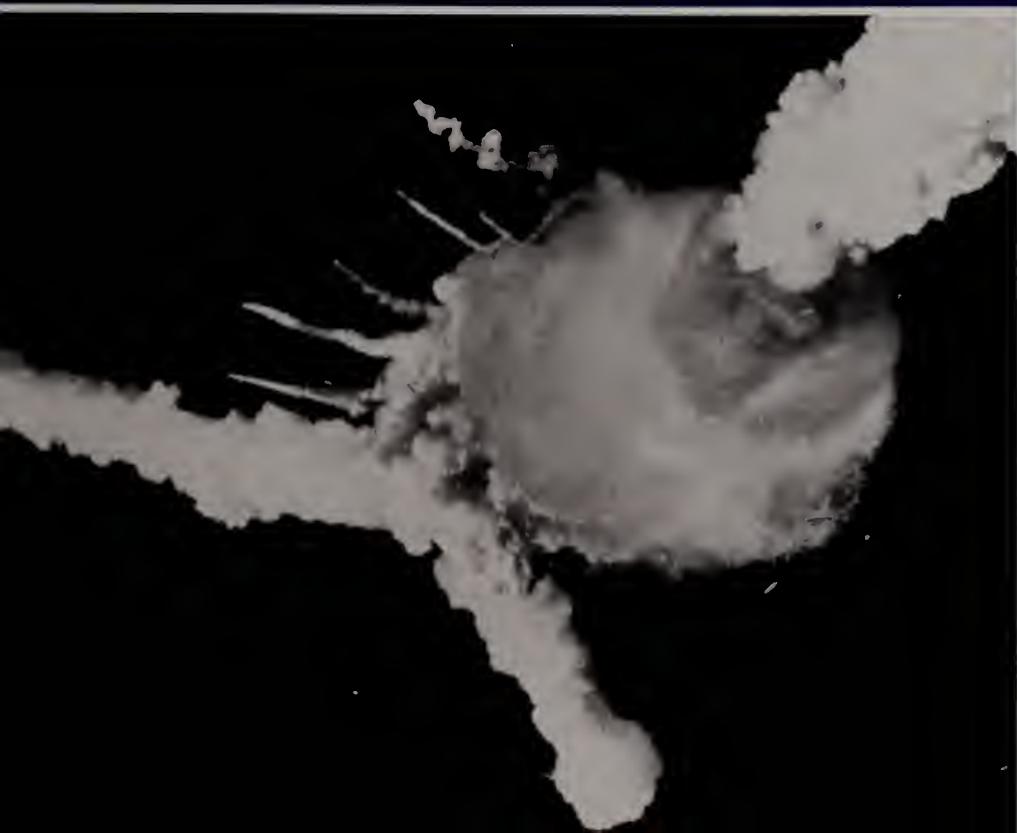

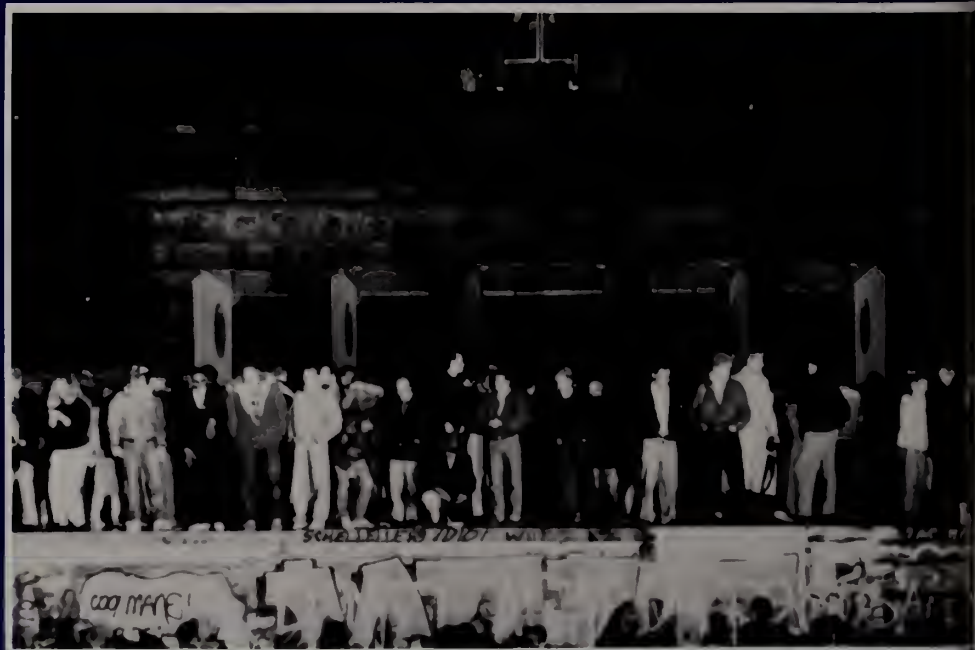

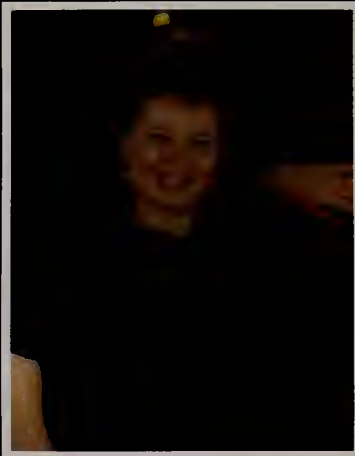

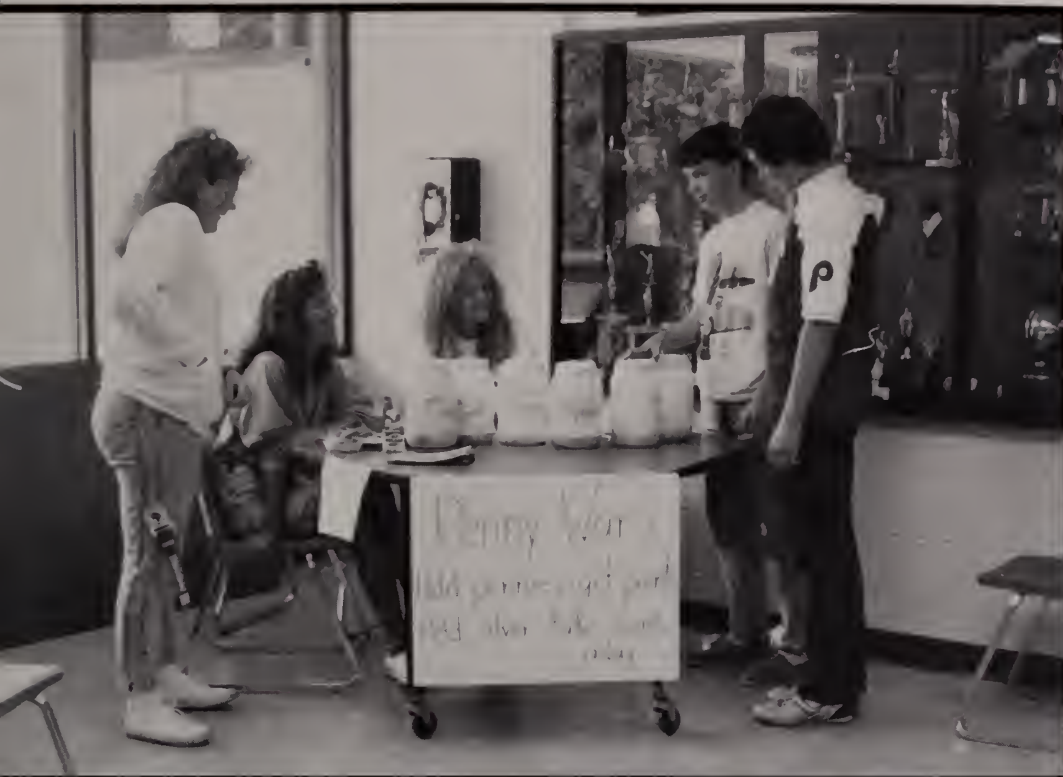

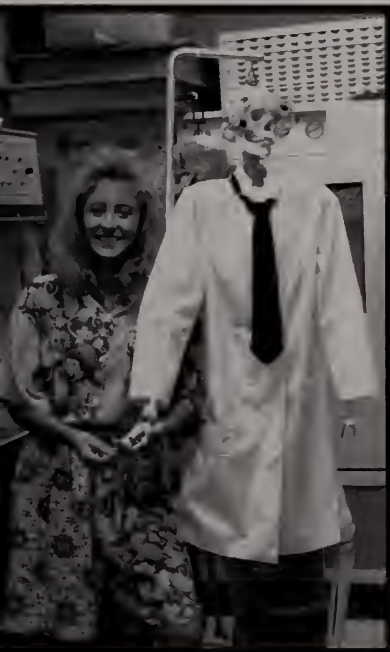

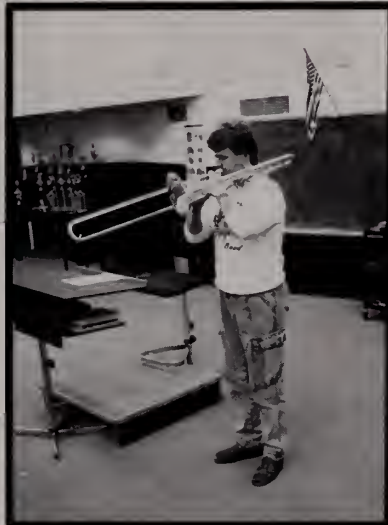

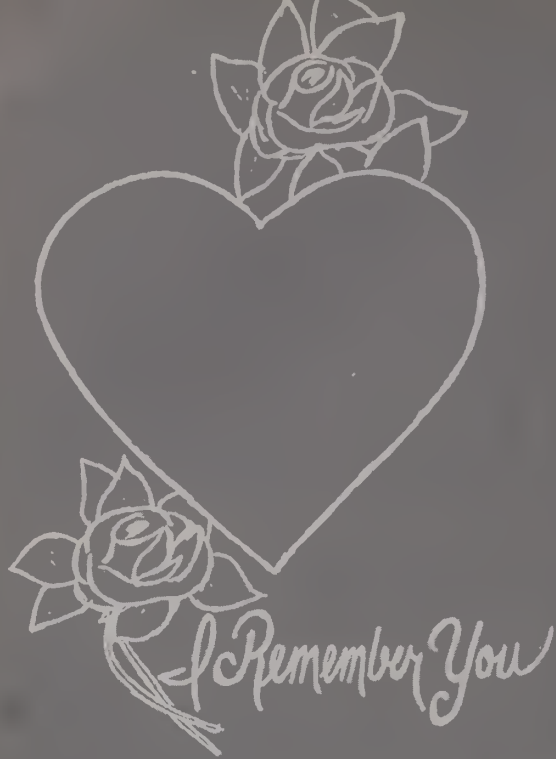

Much was expected from the team of 1989. Another State Championship was the goal. Coach Howard had high hopes for his team, but the Panthers would be tested many times before the end of the season.

In August, The Panthers stomped Raceland in the Pike County Bowl, but this was only one victory on the road to the State playoffs. The first shut out of the season came when Pikeville played their arch rival — the Paintsville Tigers.

The Panthers had only a single loss in the last three seasons. They suffered this defeat against the Belfry Pirates, a Class AAA school and one of the best teams in the region. "You can't make mistakes in a big game like this one and win," said Howard. Even though the defeat was a hard blow to the team, their hard work and determination never failed. It was this drive which carried them into the playoffs. The most impressive and the most exciting game the team played this year was the last step to the State Finals — the Beechwood Tigers. "We won this game with our offense," said Howard, pleased with the performance of his entire offensive squad. With the path cleared, the Pikeville Panthers were on the road to the State Championship finals against the Trigg County Wildcats.



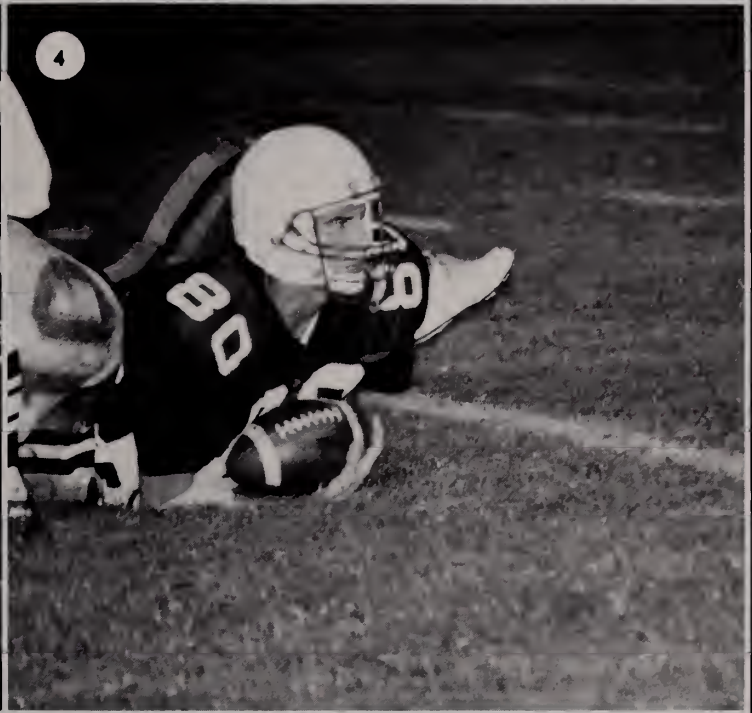

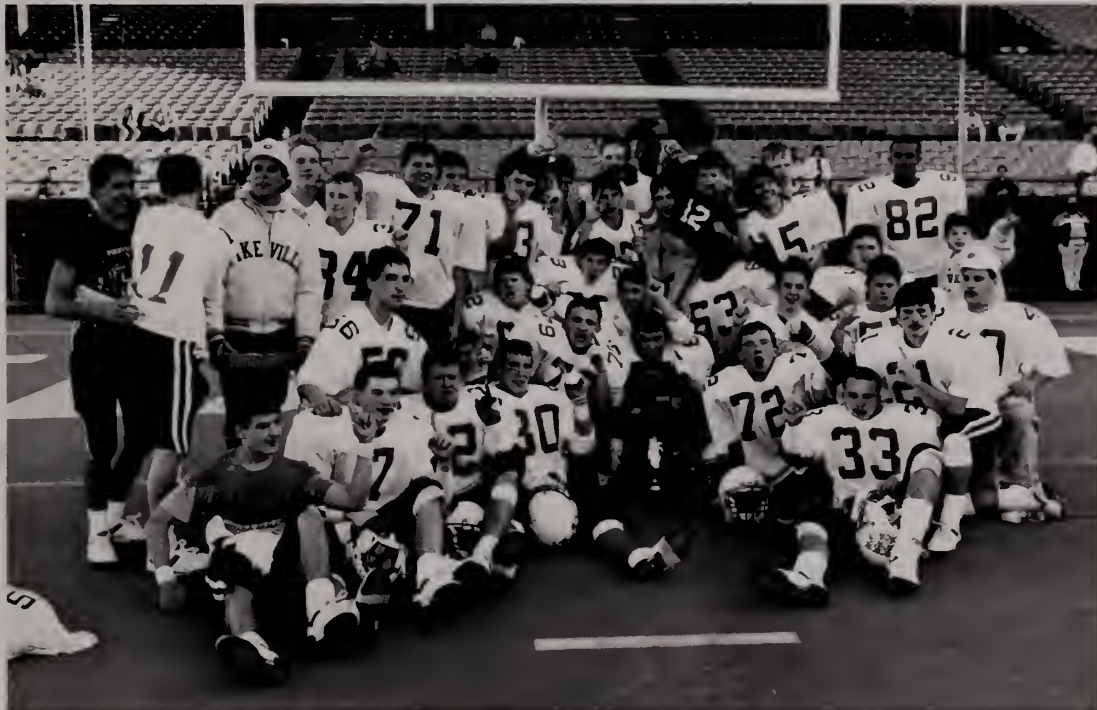
"Champions Rise To The Occasion"

"You start out in the heat in July and your goal is the Playoffs. This is payday." That's what Coach Hillard Howard had to say about the Class A Championship game with Trigg County at Cardinal Stadium in Louisville on December 2.

Pikeville stopped Trigg County star tailback Greg Bridges and unleashed its own star, Steve Bailey, to score a 20-7 victory in the Class A state title. Pikeville thus became the first team in the 30-year history of the Kentucky high school football playoffs to win three straight championships.

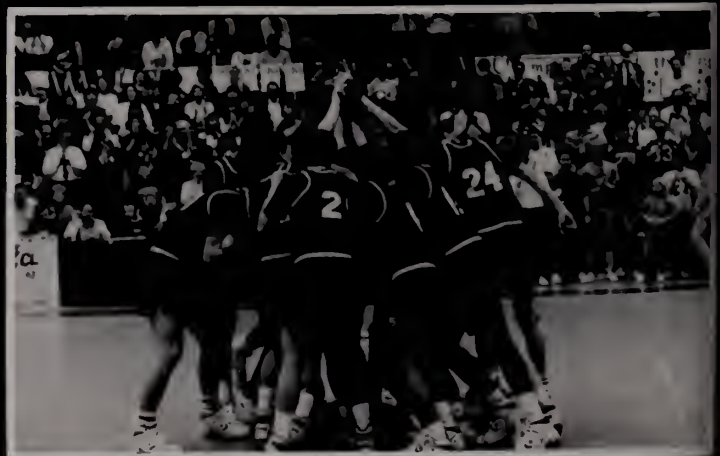
(Left) As the Panther offense leads the way, Steve Bailey travels through the Trigg County defensive line to score another touchdown.

GLORY DAYS RETURN TO PHS

The Panthers won consecutive 59th District and Pikeville Invitational Championships for the first time in over 15 years. They had a 23-4 regular season record, the best since 1957. The All A 15th Regional Championship and All A State Tournament appearance was added to their list of accomplishments. Leading the way in scoring, Senior Johnny Hale became the 18th Panther to score over 1,000 points. He now holds 12th place among the all-time PHS scoring leaders. Another asset was three triple doubles and numerous thunder dunks by Senior Steve Bailey. With an impressive record of his own, Senior Brien Wilson's sixty-one percent field goal average tied him with Emil Dixon (1959) for the school's single season record. Setting another record, Brien had 32 assists when the Panthers faced the Sheldon Clark Cardinals. The 89-90 Panther Basketball team set or tied numerous records, drew tremendous crowds, and created basketball excitement not seen around PHS since the 50's. ROLLING TO VICTORY

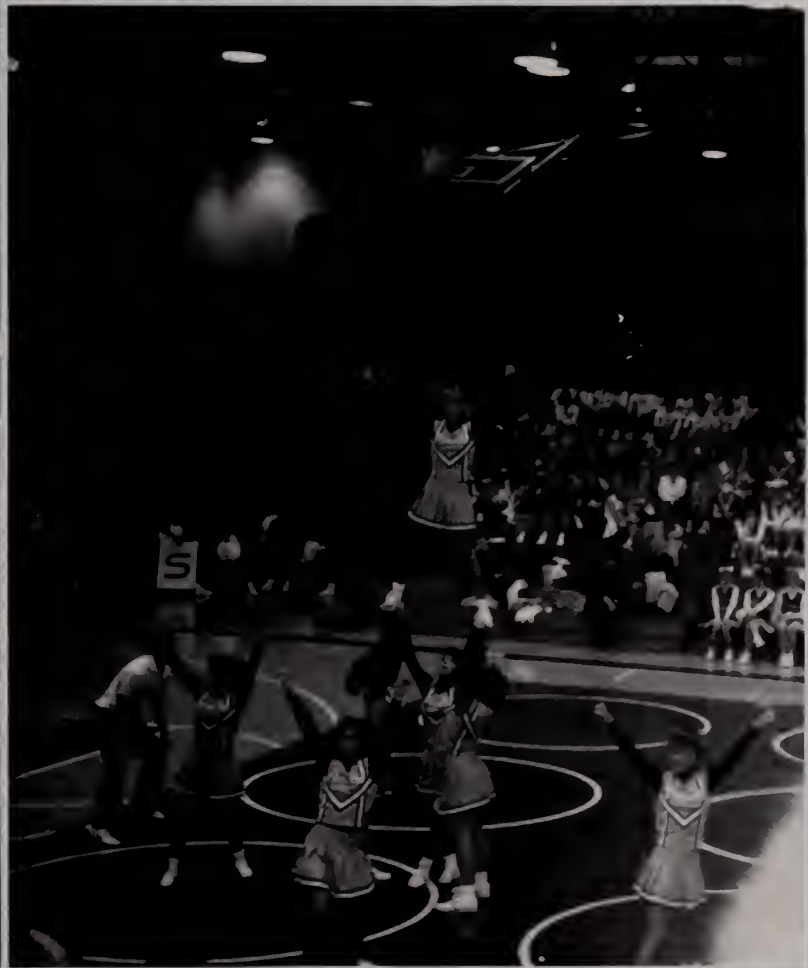

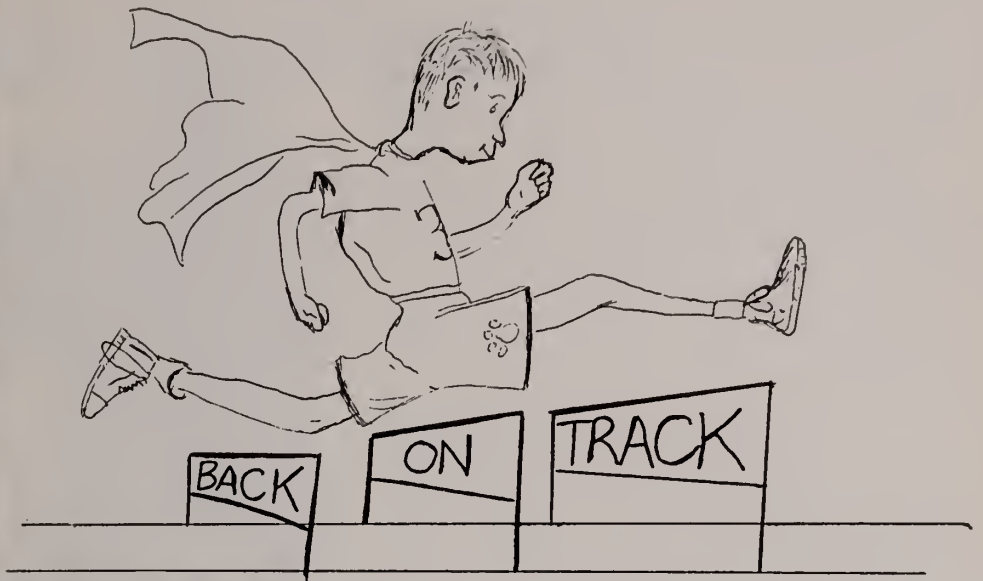
IT'S A "HIT"

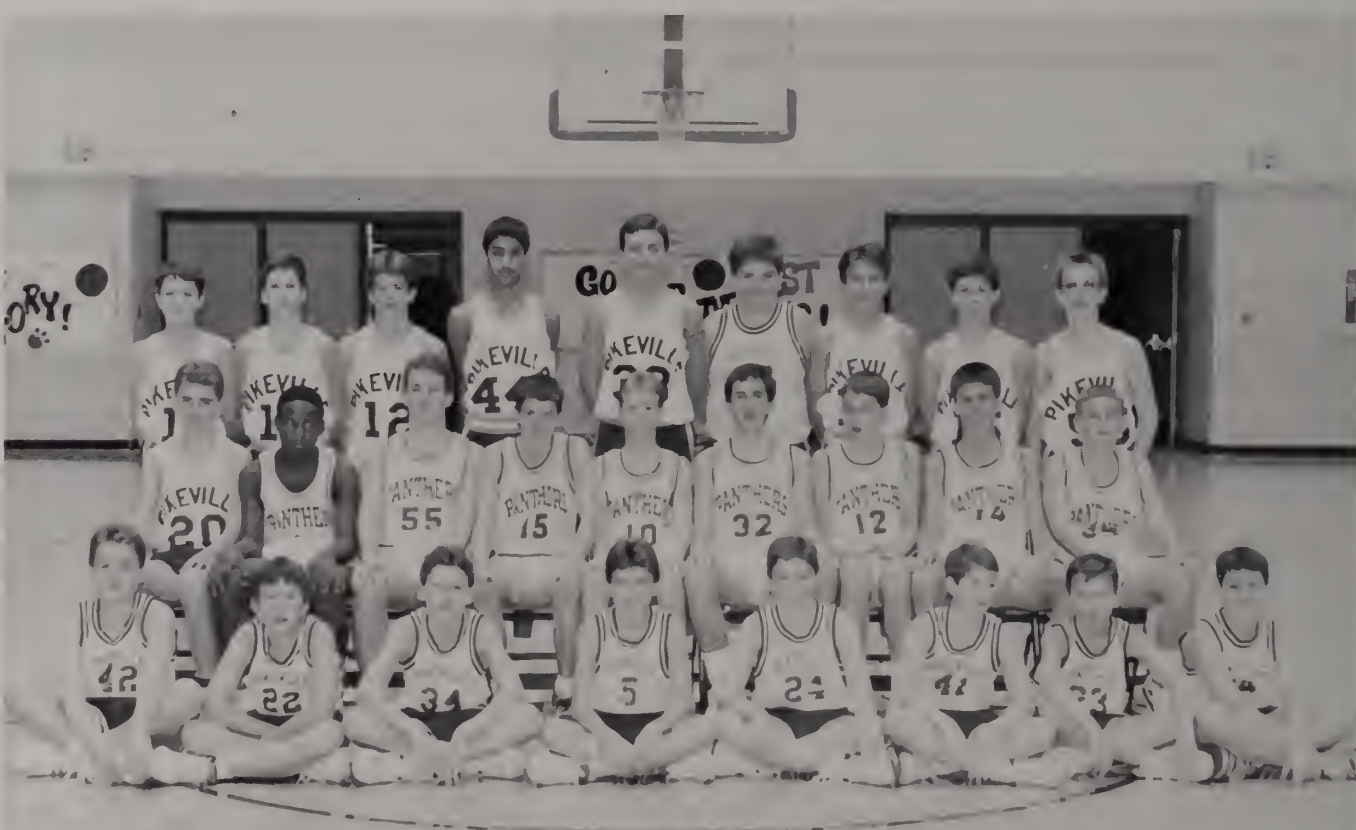

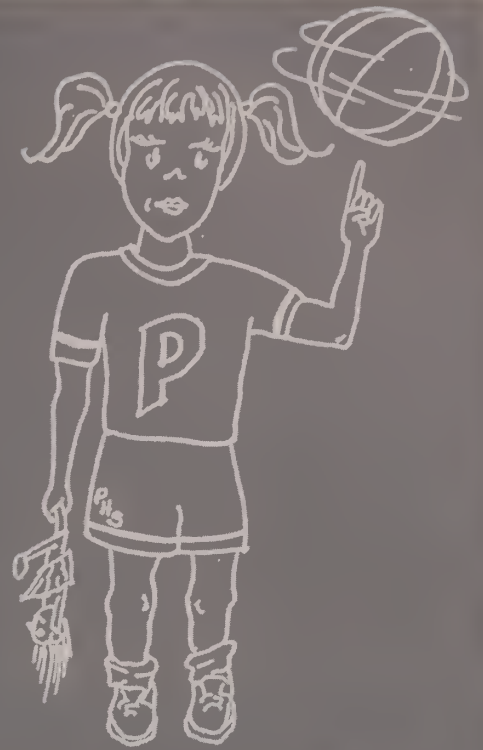
