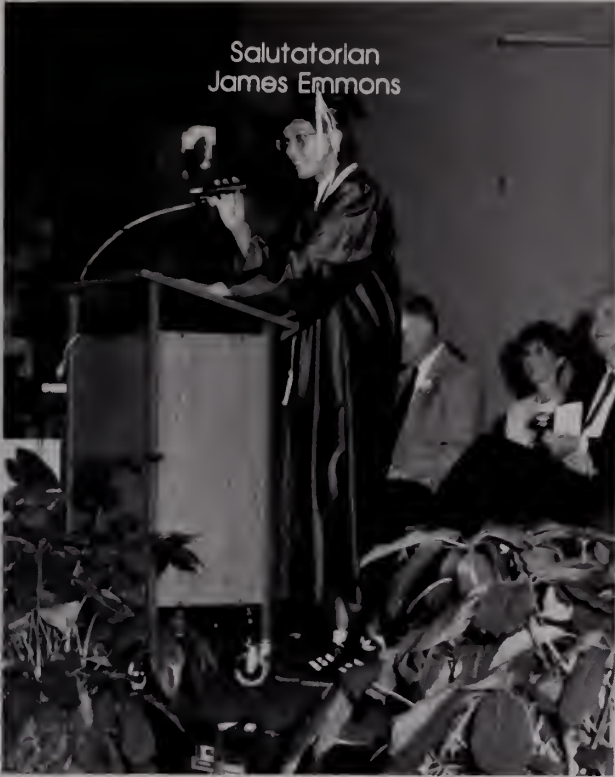


The Final Scene

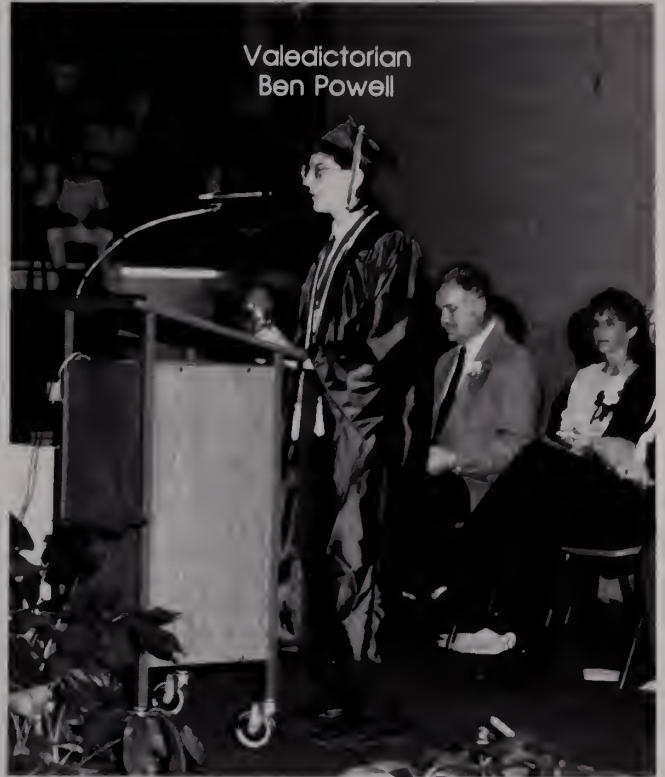

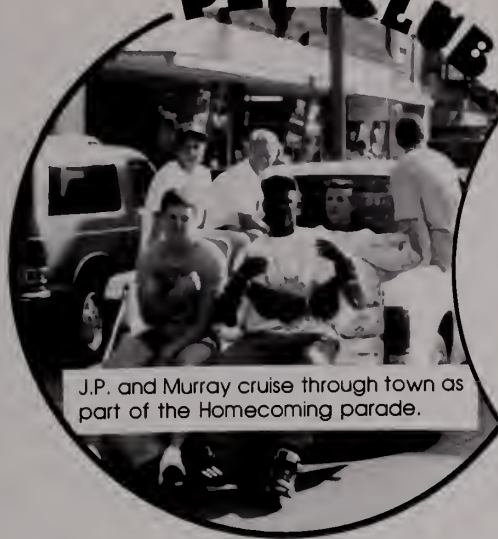

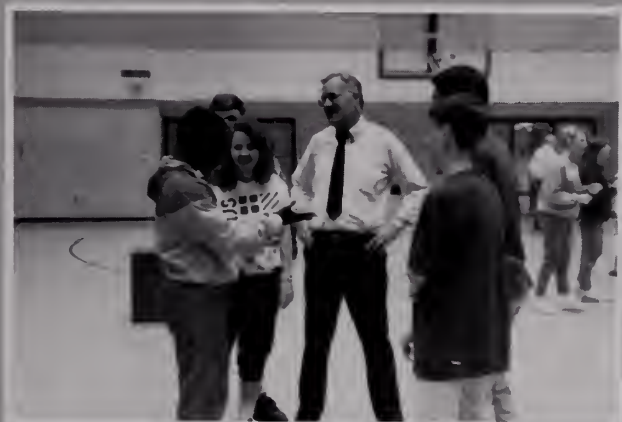

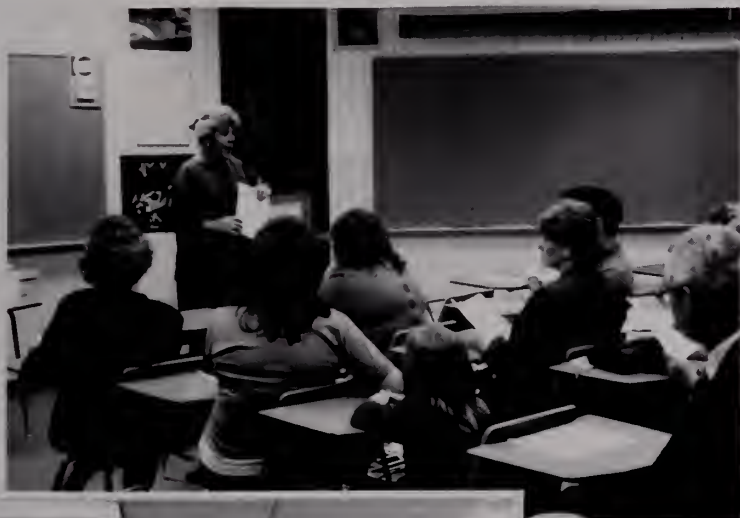

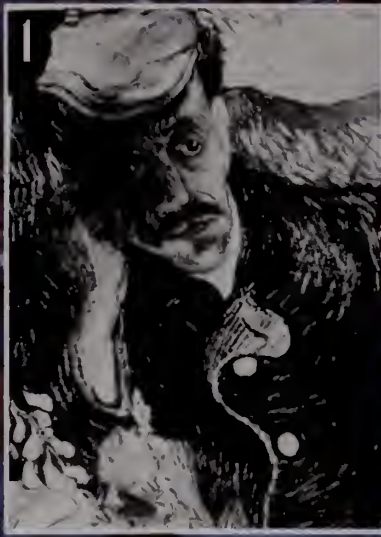

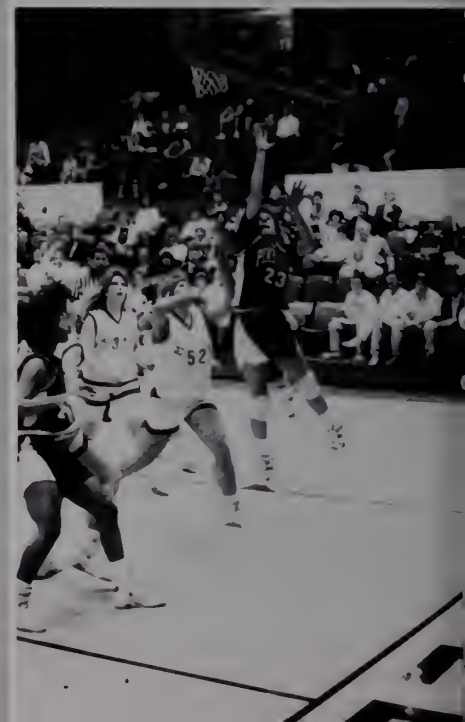

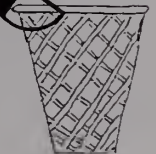

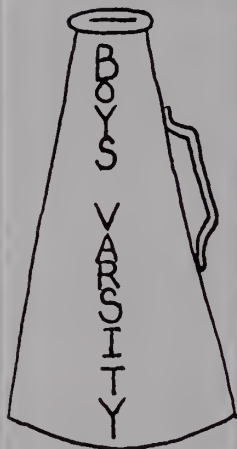

IN REMEMBRANCE

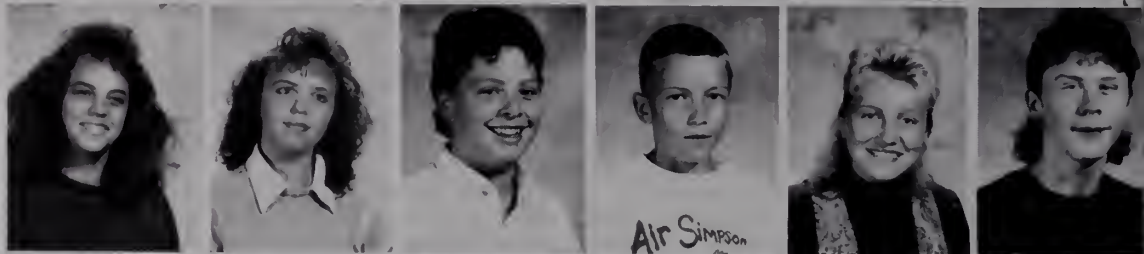

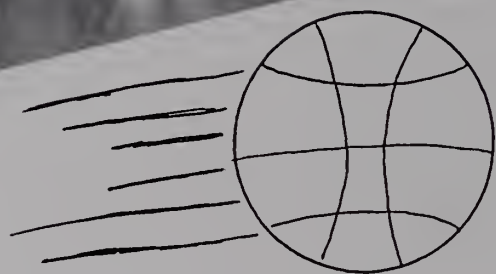
YOUNG GUNS

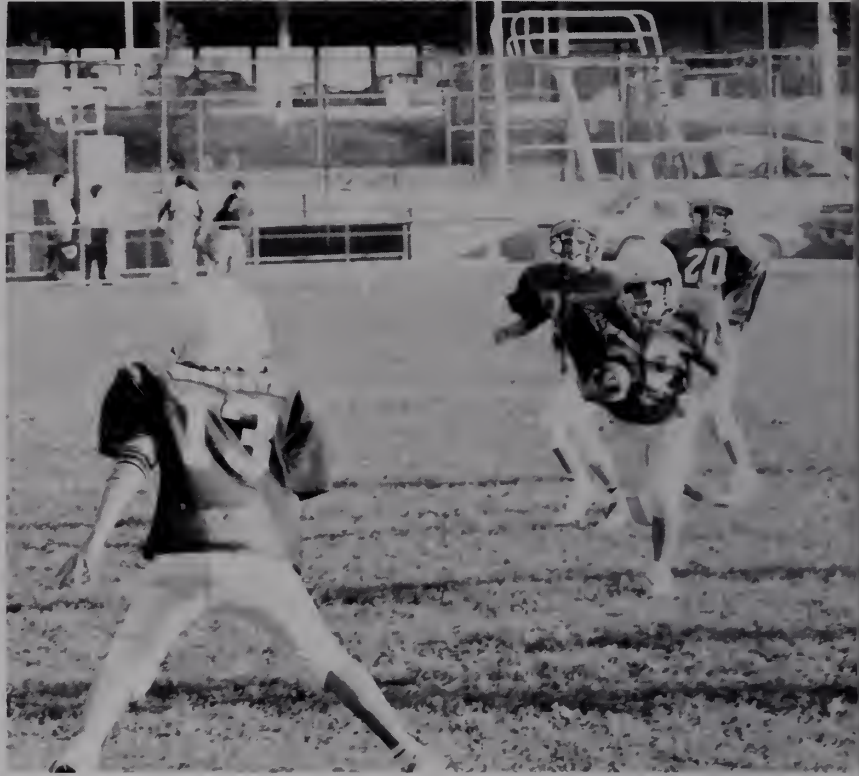

We hope that you enjoy this yearbook as much as we and the staff enjoyed creating it. We want to wish next year's staff the best of luck for a successful encore performance.

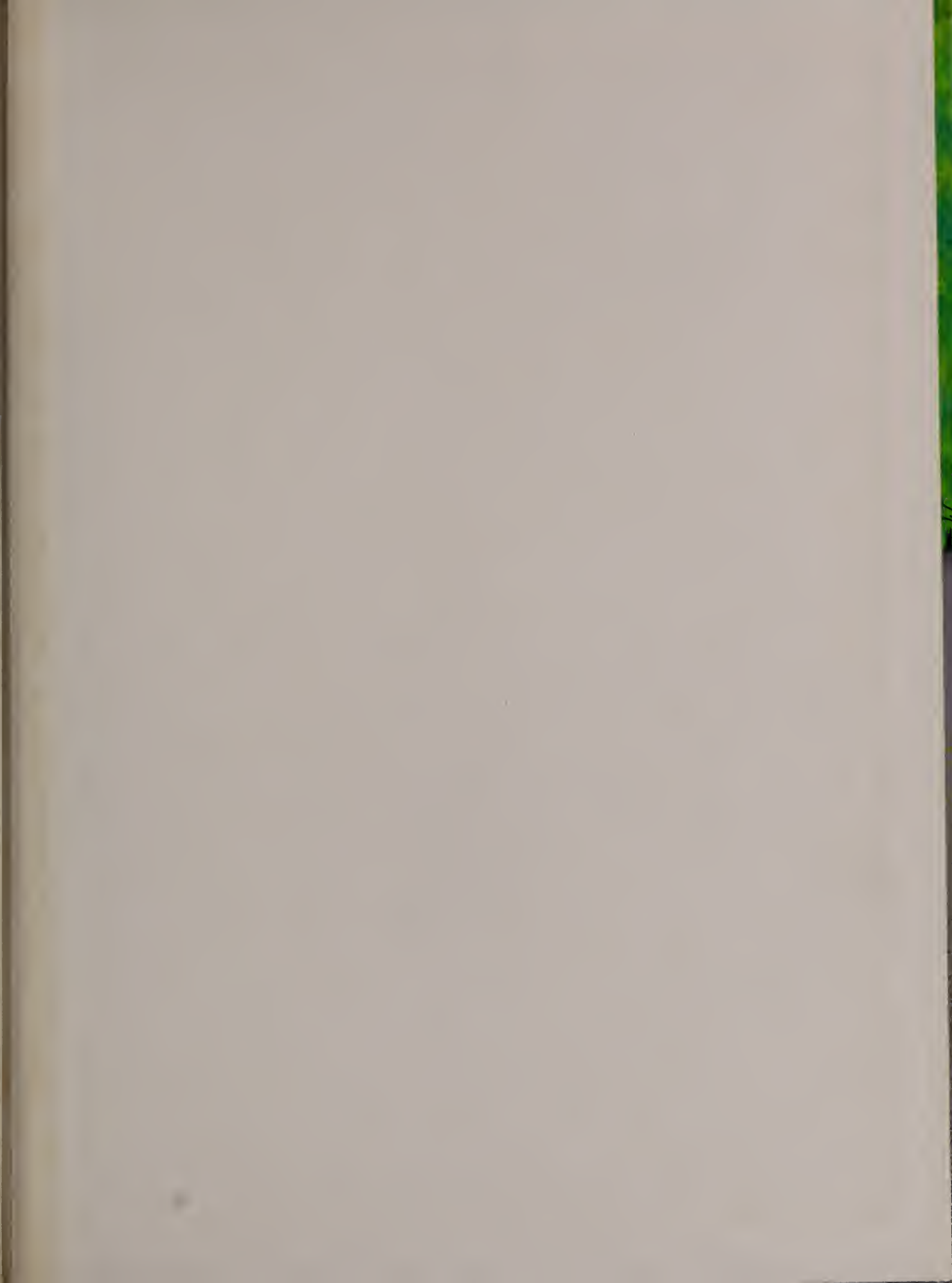
