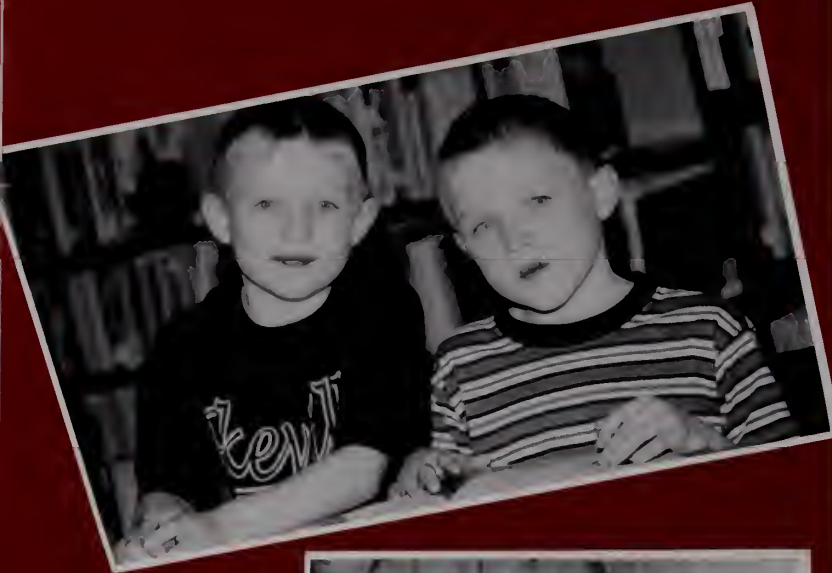

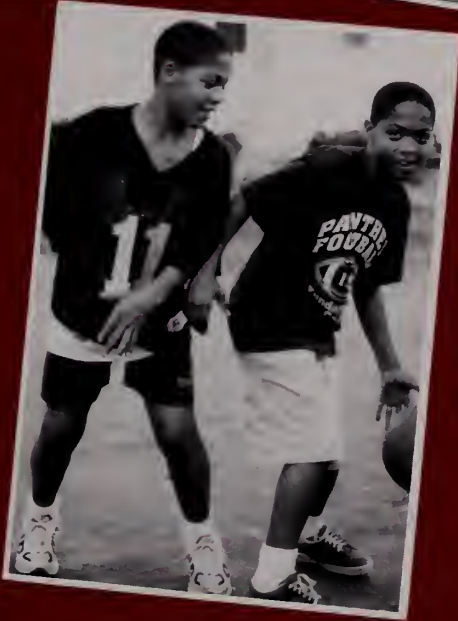


DOUBLE TROUBLE

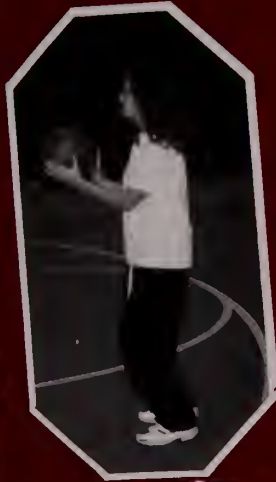

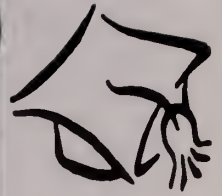
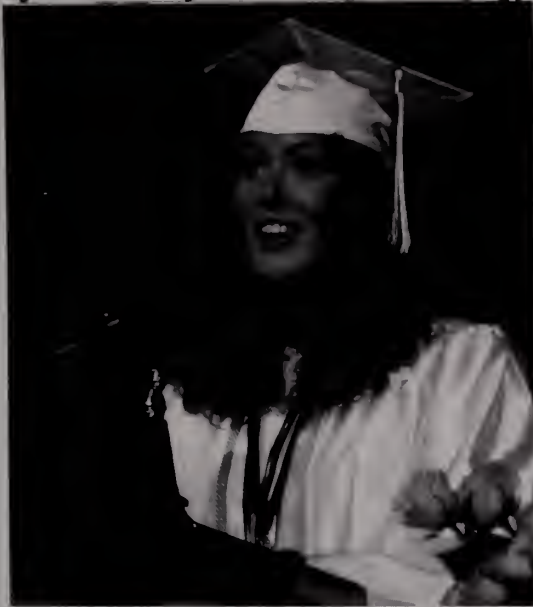

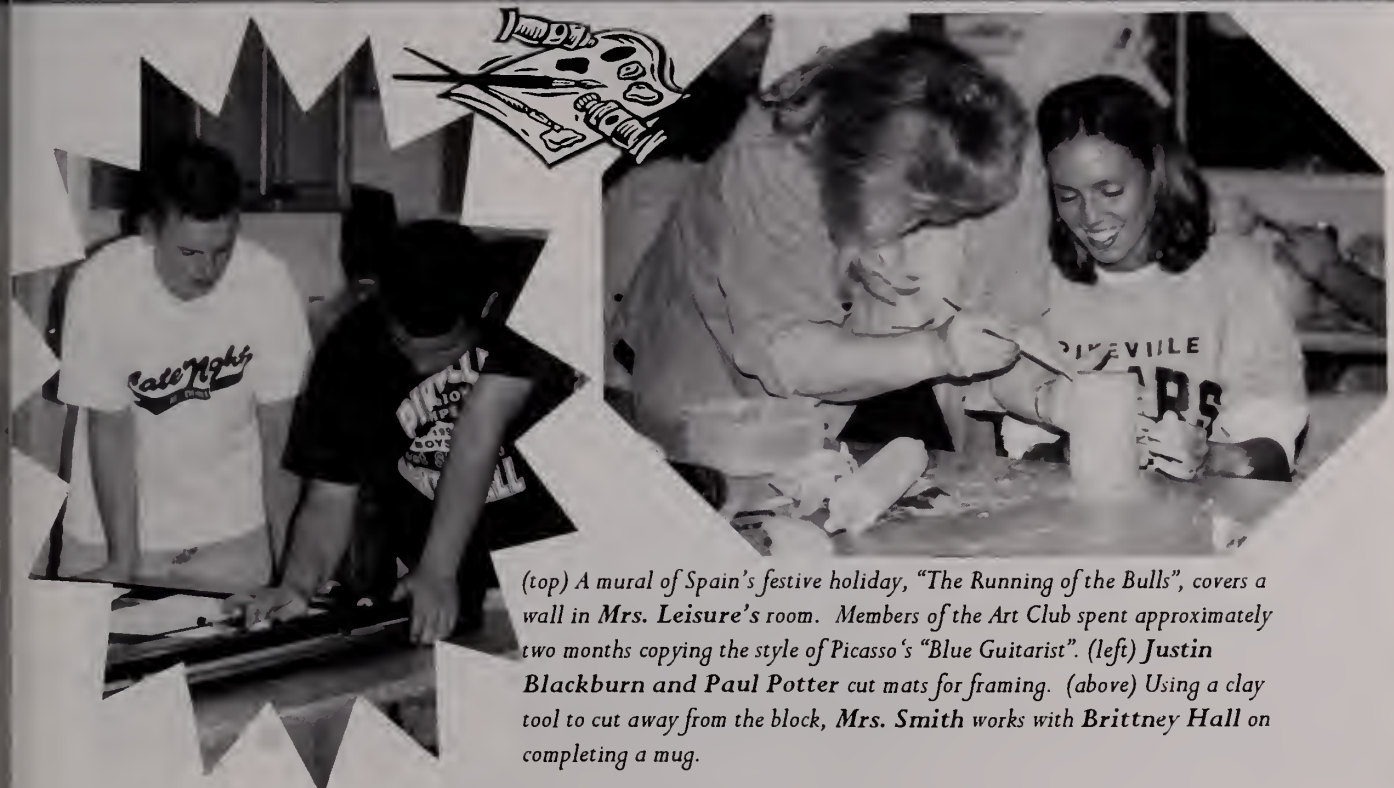

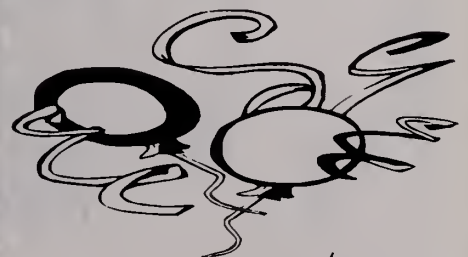

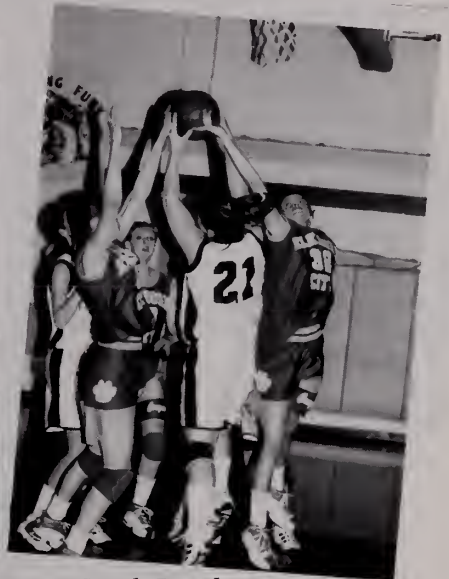

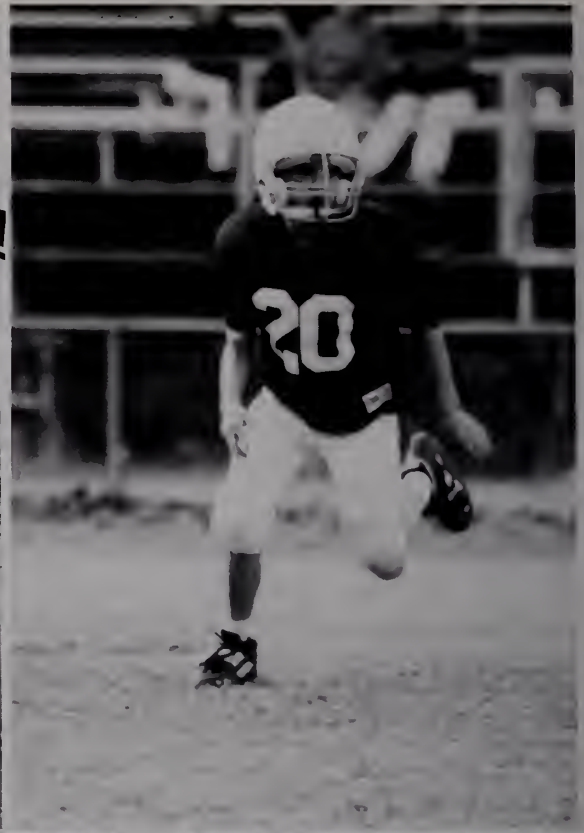

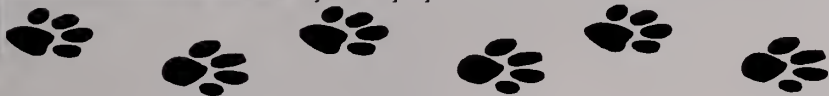

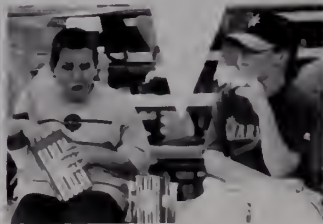
