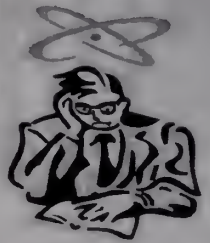

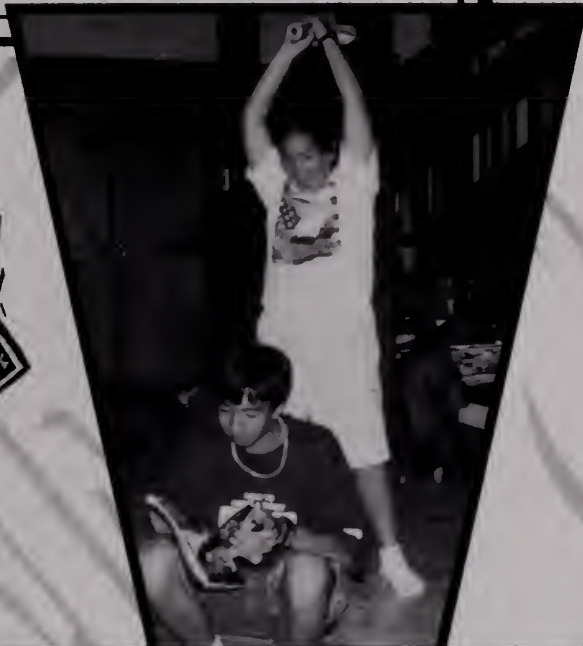

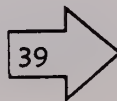

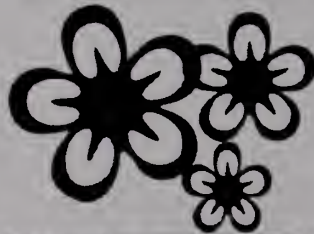

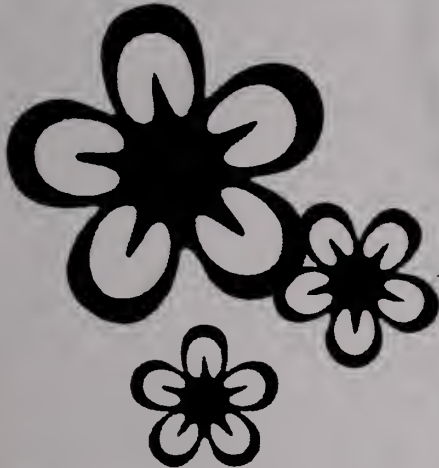

With all Regional starters returning, the Panthers have developed a strong nucleus for the future!

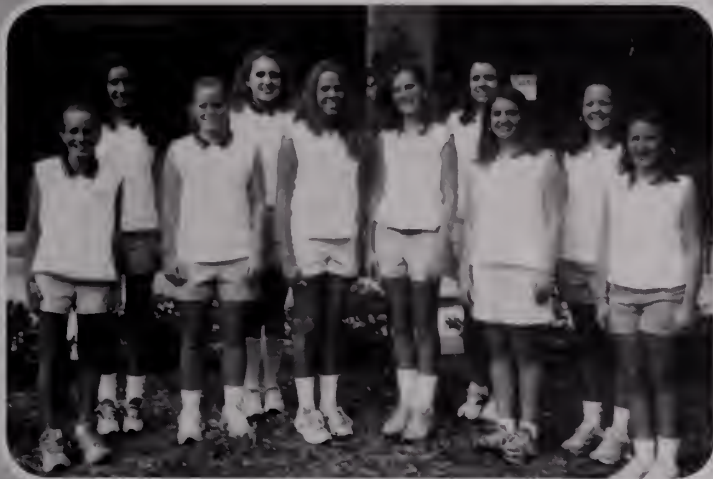

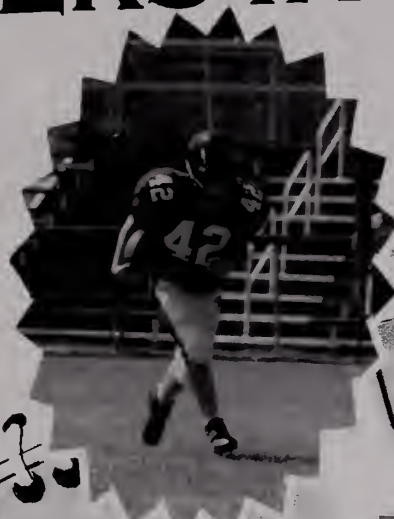
