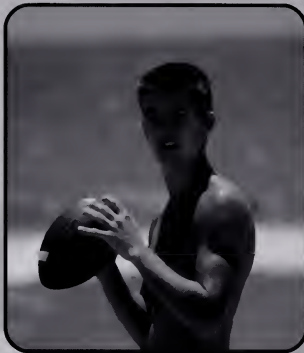

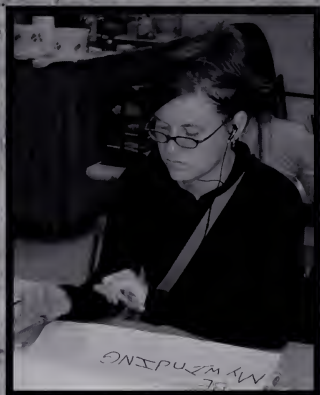

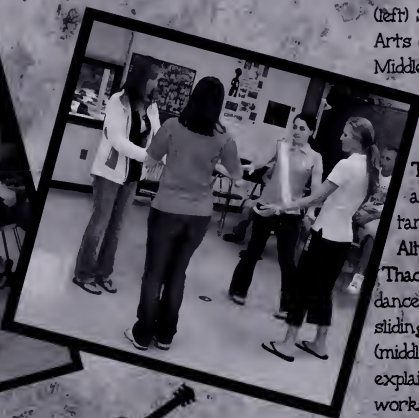
Sharing a talent is a way to specialize an individual's character by enhancing skills or learning new skills. PHS students make good use of their talents, both inside the classroom and out in the community.

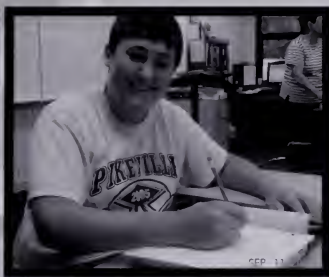

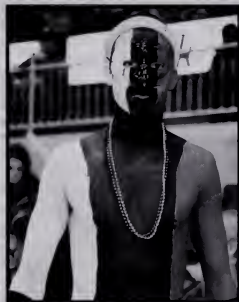

All County, All District, and All District Jazz performances once again showcased their talents. However, the defining moment of the year was clarinet player Virginia Francis being named All-State.



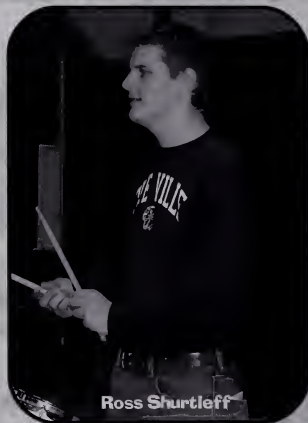

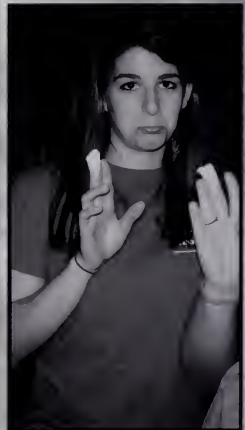

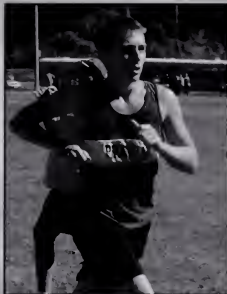

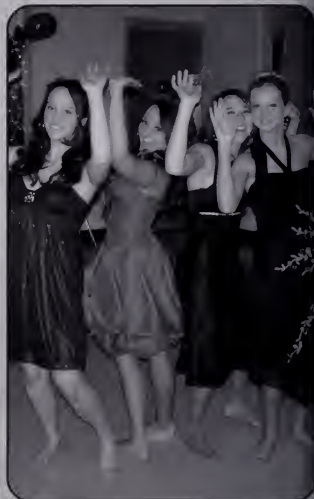
