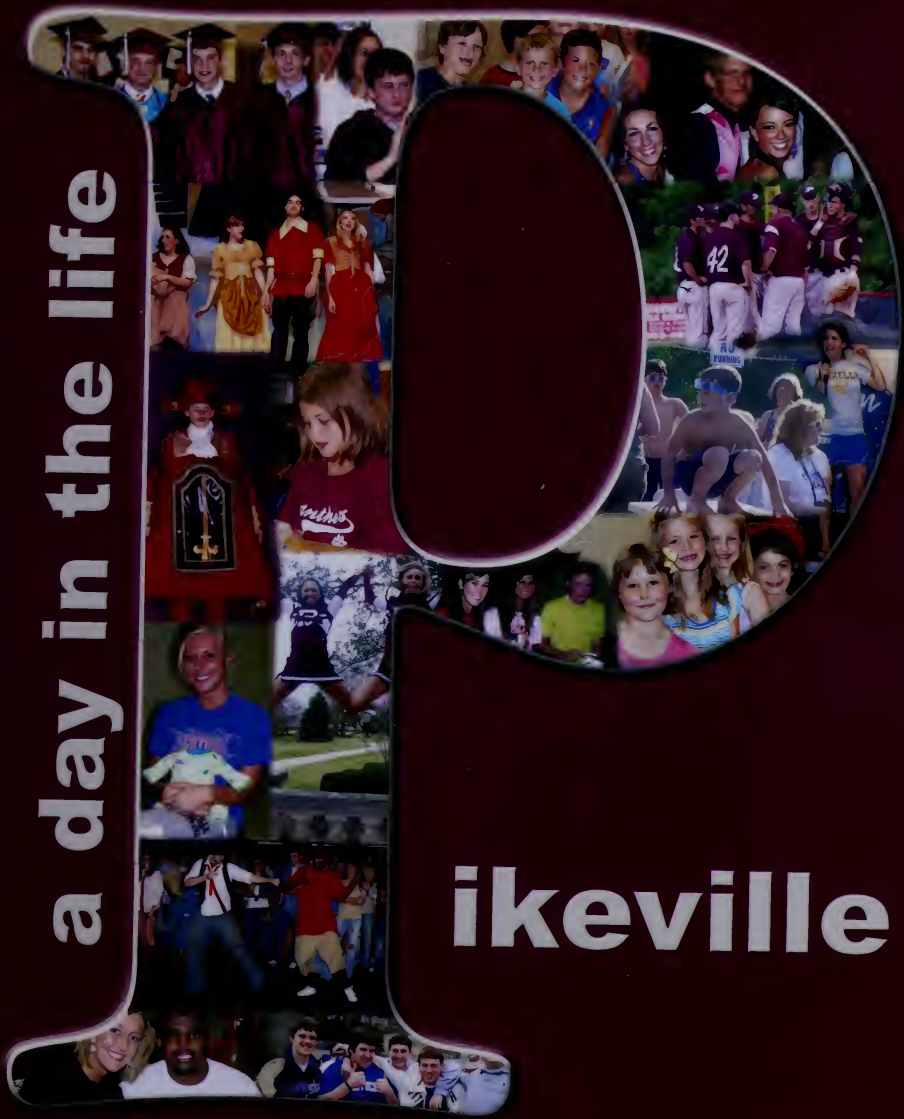

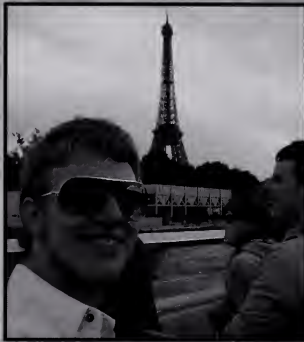




Everything...

Whether it be a competition, volunteer work, or vacations, these guys made it a priority to have fun!

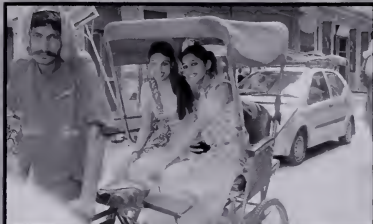

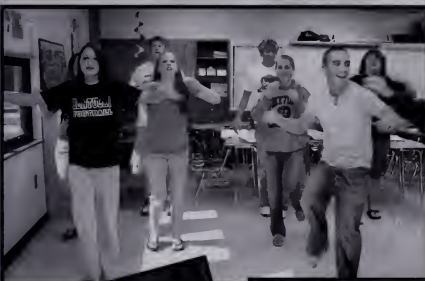

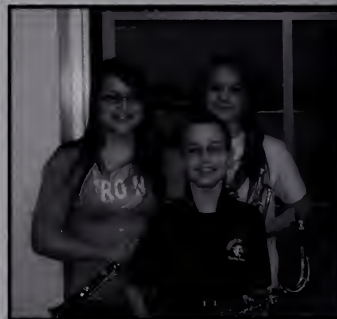


Family

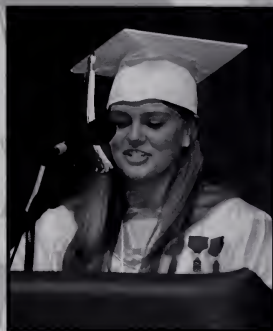

Academic Team Posts a Successful Season

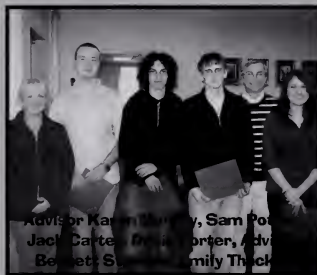

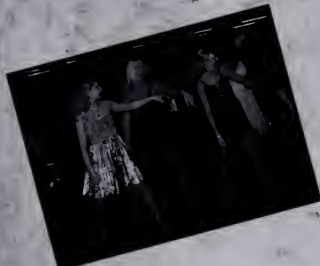
