Whether students chose to spend their break laying by the pool or hanging with friends, PHS students came back to school refreshed and ready to go.

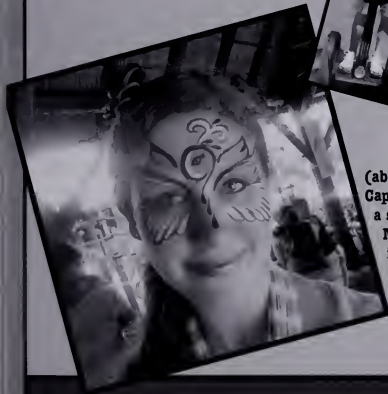

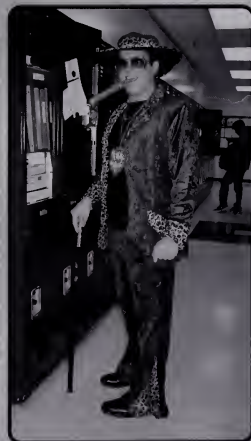


Celebrating the Unusual

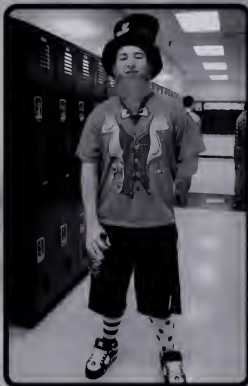

What's Your Learning Style?

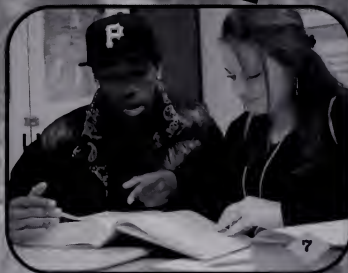
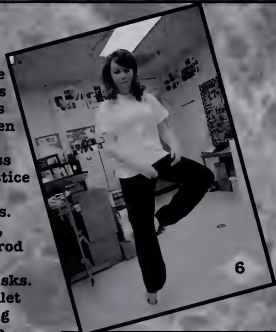
Are you a visual, auditory, or kinesthetic learner? Knowing your learning style will help you develop strategies to compensate for weakness or capitalize on strengths.

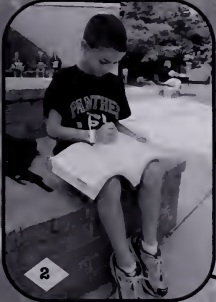

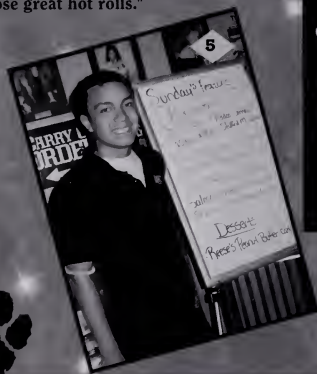
We Work Hard for the Money!

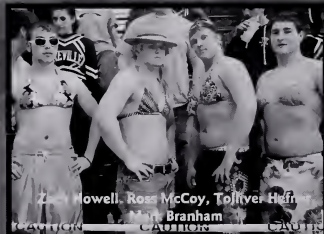
Panther fans share a tight bond. No matter what the occasion may be, they come out in full force to support their teams.

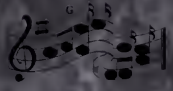


The Spirit of the Renaissance

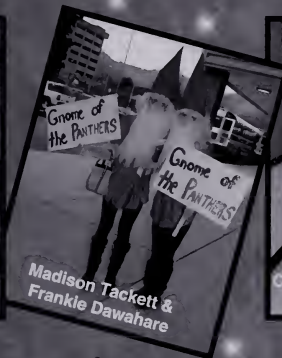

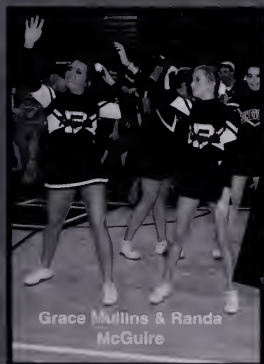

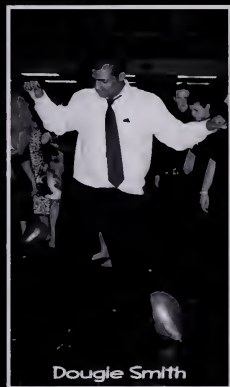

Twenty skits were performed in ten minutes each with each one focusing on a different theme. Some were light-hearted, others more thought-provoking, and a few with a serious message.

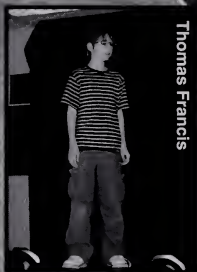

Abigail Stanley, the event director, Frankie Dawahave, PHS created the Spring Drama production "The Diary of Anne Frank" February 18, 2010.

Anne Frank kept her diary from June 12, 1942 - August 1, 1944, unaware that in a month she would be forced into hiding with her family because Hitler's Nazis would try to imprison them for being Jewish. Anne recorded her innermost feelings in her diary, which she named "Kitty".

Four other people, along with her family hiding in the Secret Annex, were arrested on August 4, 1944. The two secretaries working in the building found Anne's diaries before the Nazis ransacked the annex and some of them put the diaries in safekeeping.

After Frank, Anne's father, returned to the annex after the war and found he was the only one of the eight to survive the concentration camps. He decided to publish his daughter's diary so that readers would learn about the effects of the Nazi regime and its process of dehumanisation.

The Wildcats put up a fight, however, they couldn't pull off an upset and the Panthers took home the district crown winning 10-3.

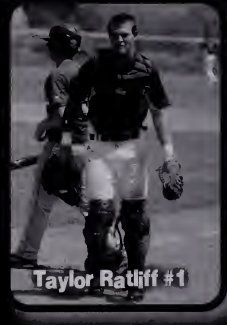
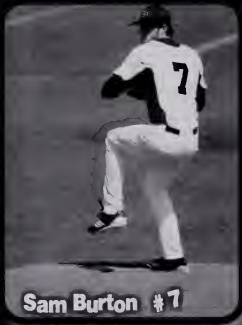
