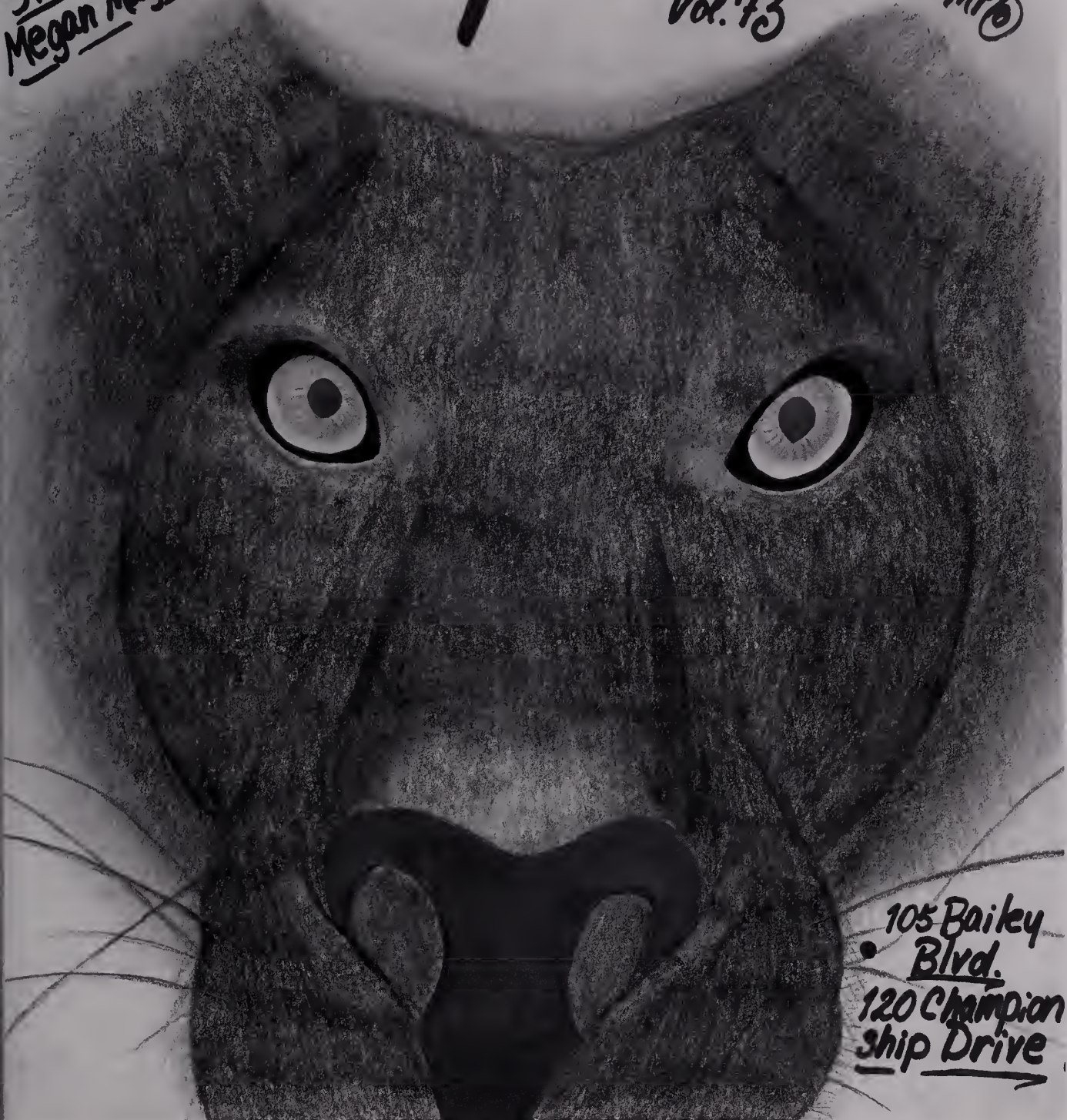

Everybody needs a vacation, an opportunity to take a deeper dive into our creative interests.

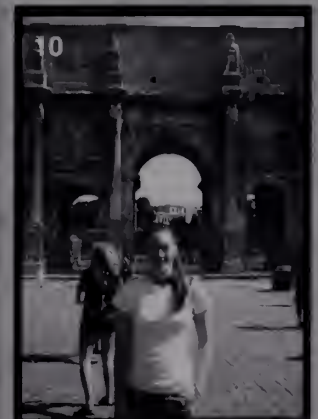
Maybe you hiked at the Breaks, headed to the beach, or attended a summer camp.

Whatever the experience, we're sure it was a pleasant few months away from the hectic schedule of the school year.



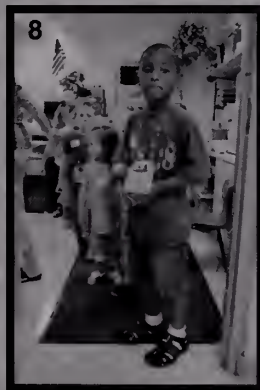

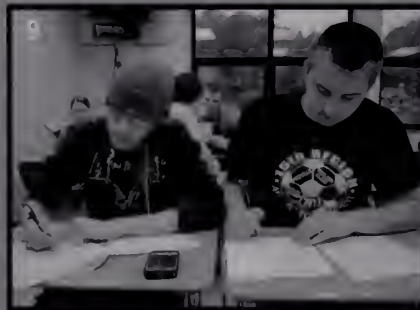
Learning by Doing

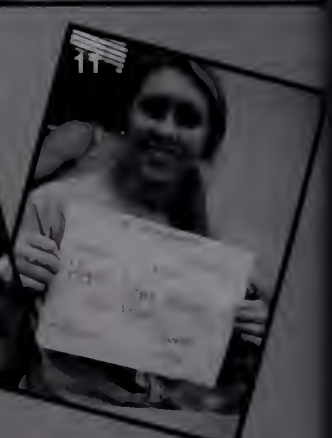
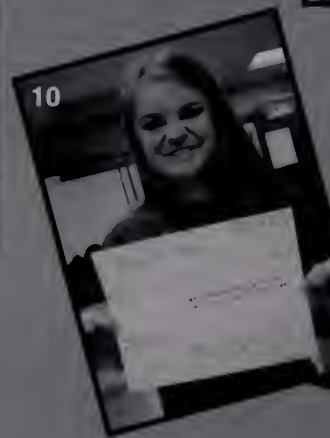


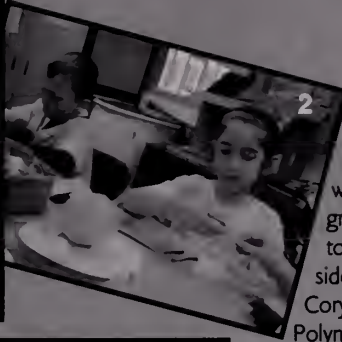

(7) Through a scavenger hunt in the state capitol, Ms. Cooley's political science classes learned about the history of the building. They were also able to sit in on a session in the Senate.

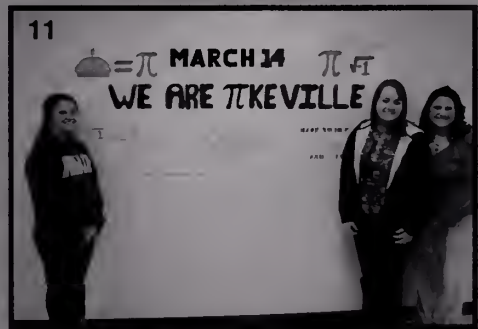
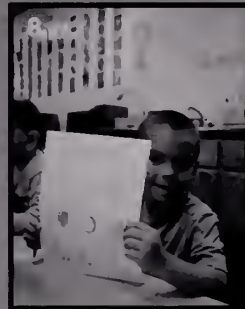
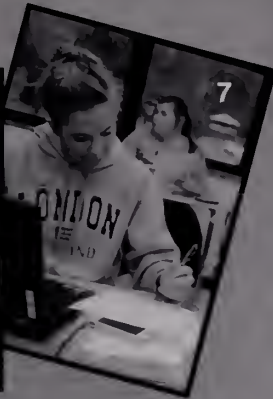
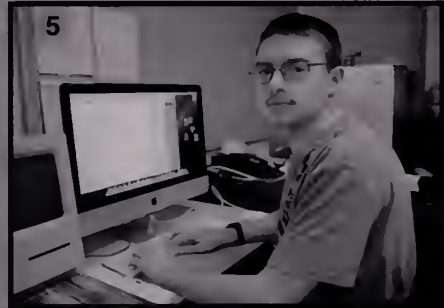

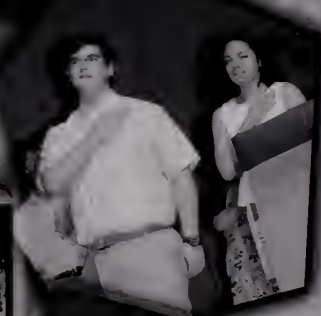

PHS fans sported t-shirts and accessories showcasing the "Coal Bowl" theme.

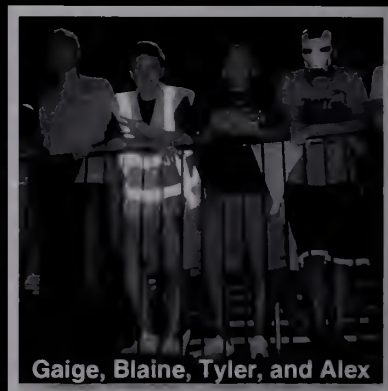

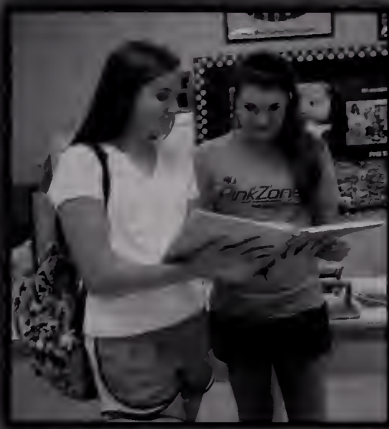
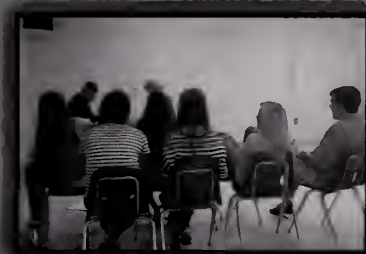
Bringing You Your News...Multimedia Class

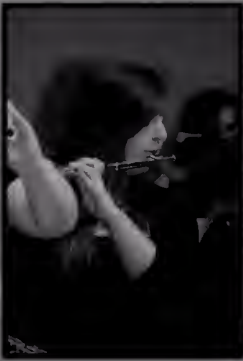
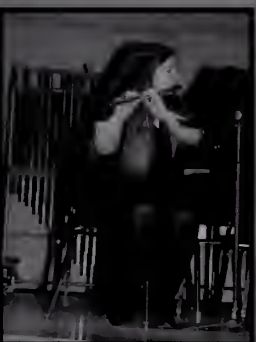

Top Ratings in KMEA District 9 Choral Assessment

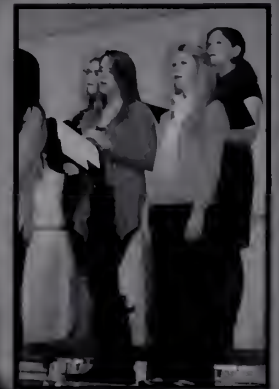
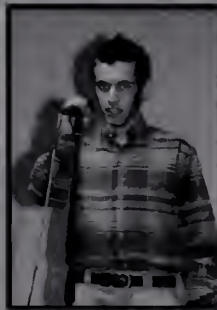
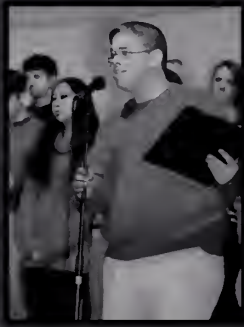

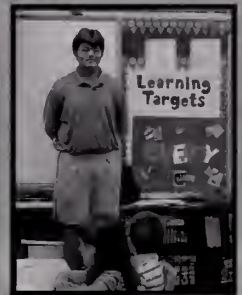
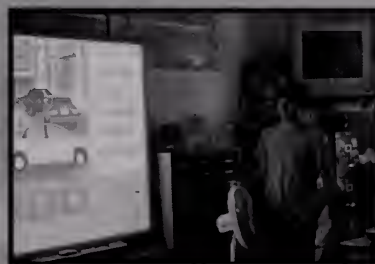
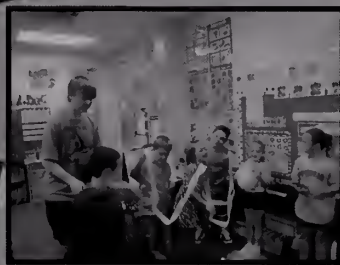
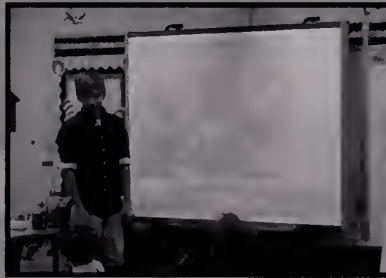
ACES (A Challenge for Exceptional Students) II class enjoyed a fruitful year with learning opportunities ranging from mock trials, designing future cities, to building their own robot. Their three main projects were NEED Energy, Mock Trial, and FTC Robotics.

Starting with First Tech Challenge Robotics, the group overcame the struggles of building and programming and, eventually, took a functioning robot to Owensboro in February. The team brought home the Motivate Award during the competition.

Next, ACES II students undertook Mock Trial and, with the help of prosecutors and defenders in town, they built a successful case. This competition was held March 14 - 15 on EKU's campus and in the Fayette County Court House. After a hard-fought first two rounds, both the prosecution and defense teams moved into the next day of competition. Winning the next two rounds, both teams received praise from the judges and came home with Ryan Crum as Best Team Witness and Phoebe Thornbury as Best Team Attorney.

The final project was the NEED Energy project. Students took a different approach with this project by teaching Pikeville elementary students about agricultural effects on energy. ACES II taught monthly lessons to first graders, emphasizing energy sources and conservation practices.

Through collaboration with the high school AP Environmental Science classes, the elementary STLP students, Primary Talent Pool, Cathy Rehmyer (local professor and avid gardener), as well as the Cedar Creek Assisted Living residents, the students made an impact on the community.

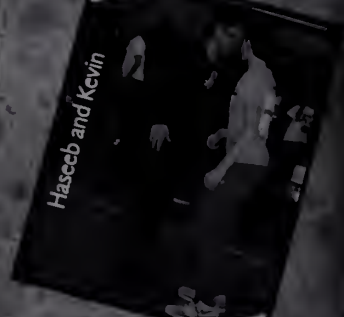
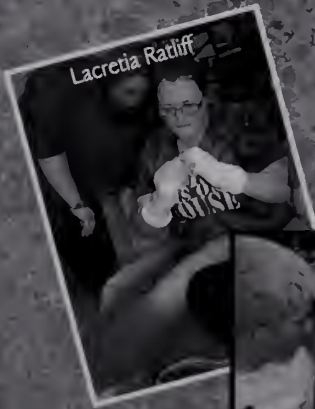
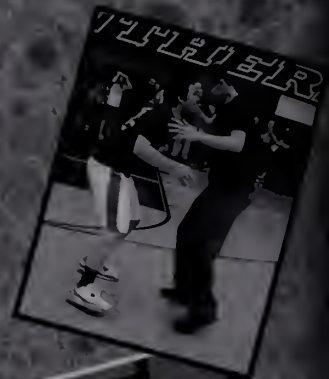
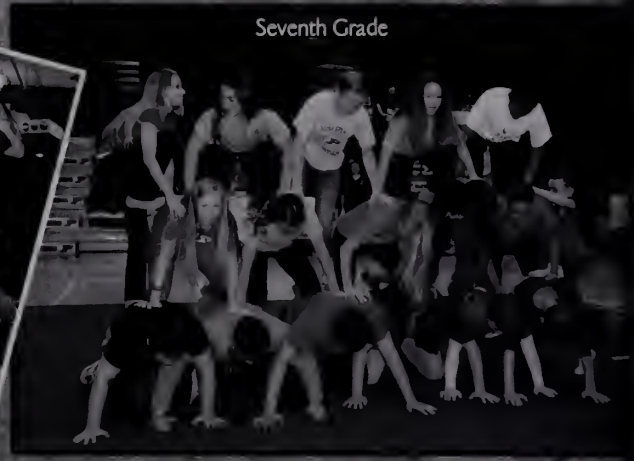
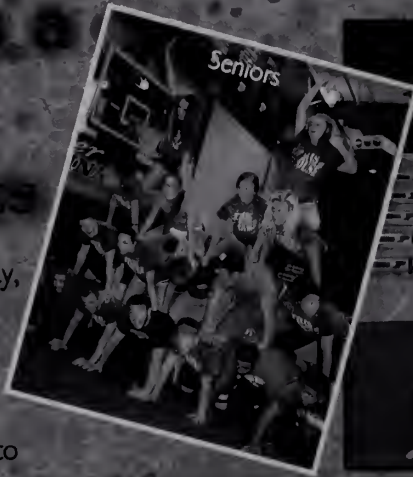


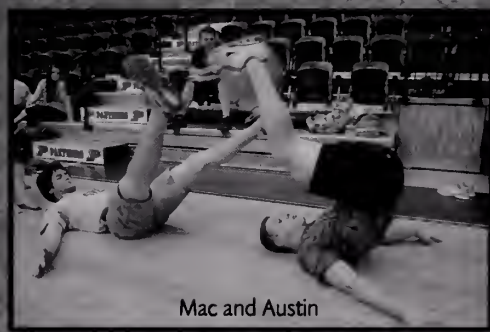
Working As a Team... Mock Olympics

The girls beat six teams in the Montgomery County Tournament, were District Champs, as well as the first team in the 15th Region to win 30 regular season games.

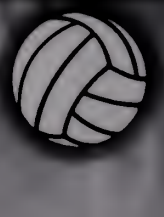
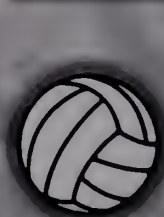
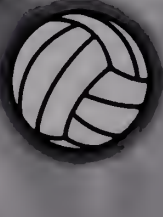
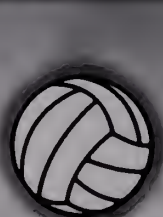
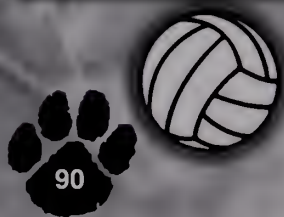

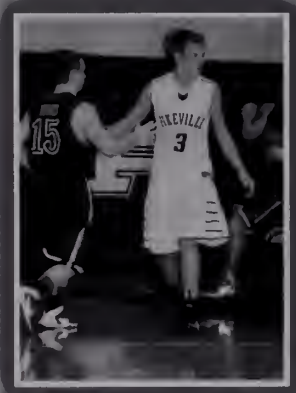
In the opening round of the 59th District Tournament the Panthers looked poised to knock off East Ridge and advance to the championship game and the 15th Region Tournament.

Pikeville finished the season with an 11-18 record.

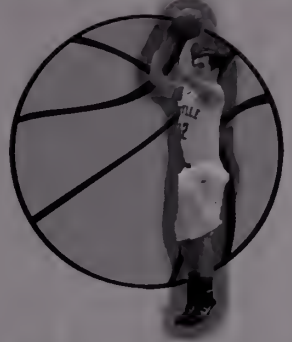

Dalton advanced to State competition in May at the Kentucky Horse Park, and Adam Swofford was named Area 9 Middle School Runner of the Year.



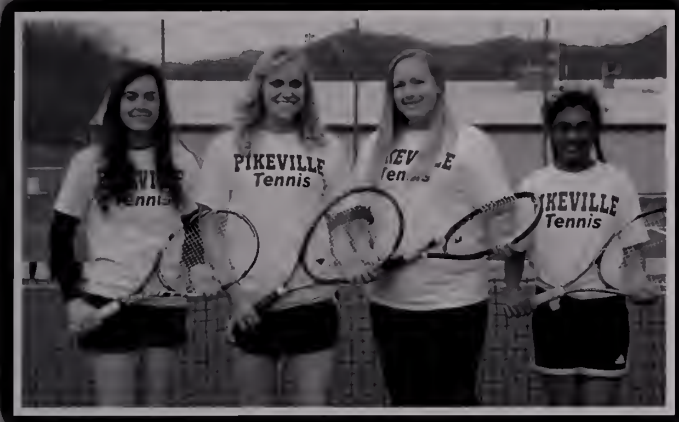

For the girls', Cailee Marcum was a singles semi-finalist. She, Patrick, and L.J. advanced to the state tournament in Lexington.



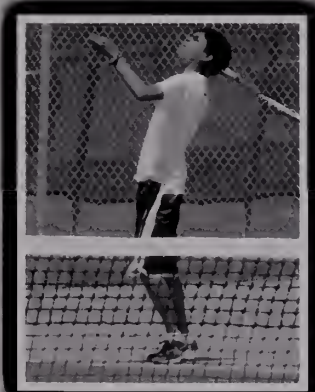

Pikeville was a well-rounded team who hit the ball well and also had solid pitching throughout the rotation with a strong defensive presence behind them.

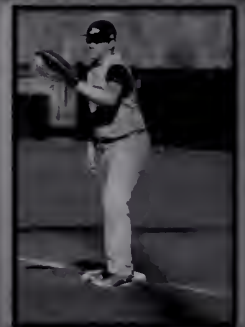
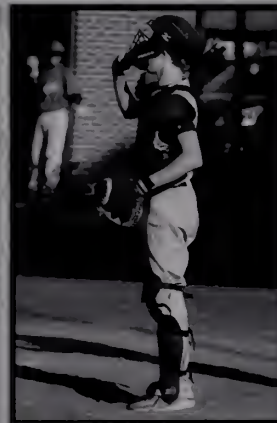
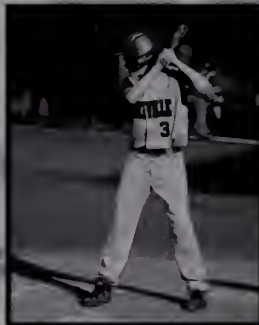
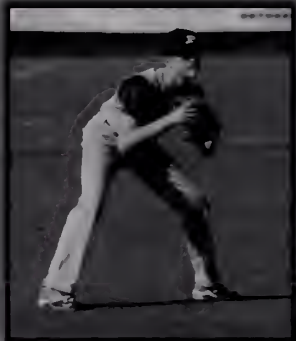
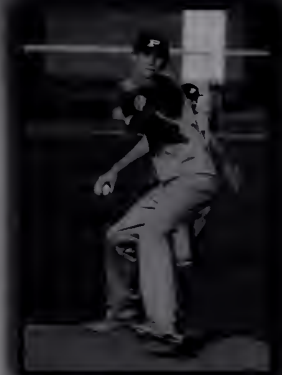
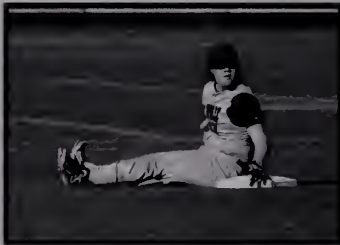
