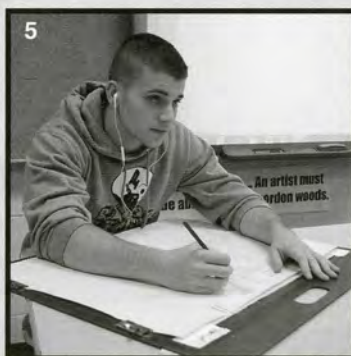


Creating Excitement in the Classroom

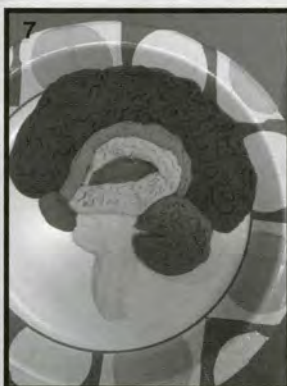

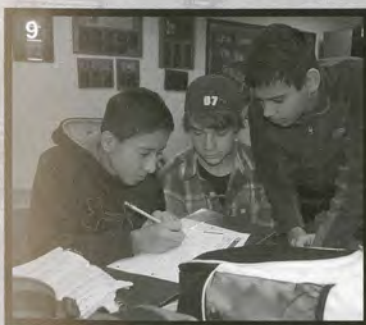

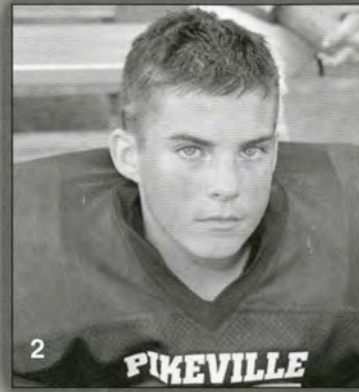
The Gift of #Throwback Thursday

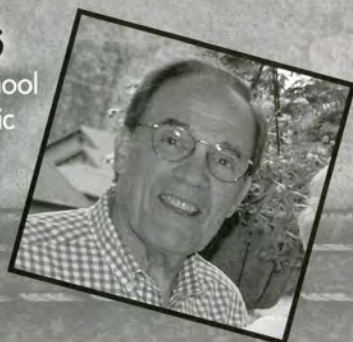

Living The Legacy

Past. Present. Future.

When the bell rang to signal the opening of the new school in the fall of 1915, approximately 150 students, grades 1-12, and nine teachers began the school year.

One hundred years later, Pikeville Independent serves approximately 1250 students with near 120 faculty and staff.

The 100-year celebration year was a time to look back, not only at this year, but also where it all began.

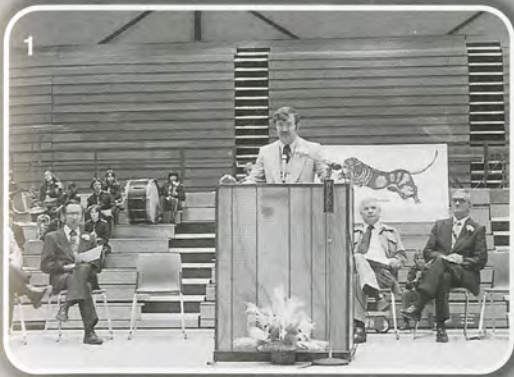


1) One of the early basketball teams was coached by Cassius "Cack" Hatcher (back row, far right). He also coached football. 2) Named superintendent in 1923 by the Pikeville City Board of Education after serving as a teacher for one year, Tybee William Oliver began a 26-year tenure as superintendent. 3) What is everyone's favorite day of the school year? The last day! John Marvin Ratliff, Johnny Sanders, John Paul Picklesimer, and Skipper Franklin (Class of 1963) showed their excitement on the last day of their eighth grade year. 4) In 1942, John Bill Trivette came back to PHS, his alma mater, and stayed for 16 years. He and John York coached this team. His years as head coach were referred to as the "Trivette Years."



5 & 6) PHS won three back-to-back state championships in 1987, 1988, and 1989. Bobby Deramus, along with the 1988 team, was featured in *People* magazine. 7) Beloved second grade teacher, Walta Mae Duncan, began her career at the Perry Cline School before starting at Pikeville Elementary. 8) In 1986, PHS won the very first Governor's Cup, the nation's first statewide academic competition. Anne Keene was the coach.

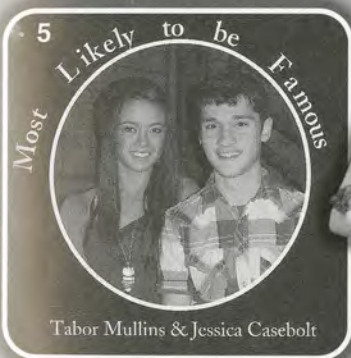




1) The first graduation held in the new school was in May 1977, in the gymnasium. First-year principal Tom Swartz welcomed the guests. 2) Bill Staggs and Susan Allen Huffman were named Mr. and Miss Pike High for the 1976-77 school year. Bill serves on the present Pikeville Independent Board of Education and Susan is a teacher at PHS. 3) In 2004, the Alumni Association and Pikeville Independent Board of Education, in a joint venture, broke ground for the Pikeville Veterans Memorial and Outdoor Classroom. It was erected outside of the Alumni Auditorium and dedicated the same year. The memorial was constructed in honor of PHS, Perry A. Cline, and Pikeville Academy alumni, faculty, and staff who served in America during times of war. 4) In 1963, the band, under the direction of Jack Taylor and drum major Paul Hoover, along with majorettes Dana Burke, Judy Hall, Paula Butcher, Margaret Wright, Judy Phillips, and Karen Watson, made the long trip to Florida for the Orange



Bowl Parade. 5) Jessica Casebolt (Class of 2011) was voted "Most Likely to be Famous" by her classmates. After high school she won the Miss Kentucky pageant and represented the state well in the Miss America pageant.

6) An impressive-looking Panther band (1971), directed by C.J. Birch, proudly wore new uniforms. They made a 10-day trip to Winnipeg, Canada, to compete in the Manisphere Band Contest. They won a superior in marching, fourth place in parade competition, and an excellent in concert. 7) The 1951 Tom Thumb Wedding



included first and second grades with Jane Wells Amos and Johnny Phillips as the bride and groom.



(8) Wright Hall was built in the late 1920s to be used as a female dormitory. Young girls lived there while they attended classes at PHS. 9) The 90th class reunion dinner/dance, held in the present gymnasium, was decorated how it would have been in the 50's and 60's, canopied in maroon and white streamers.

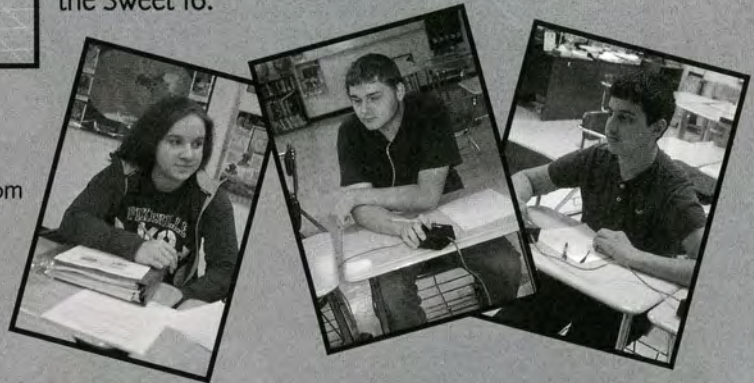

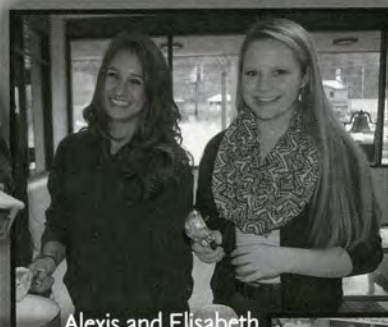
Student Council members worked throughout the year to be a voice for the students and to make themselves aware of issues relevant to the school and community.

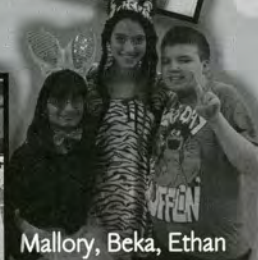

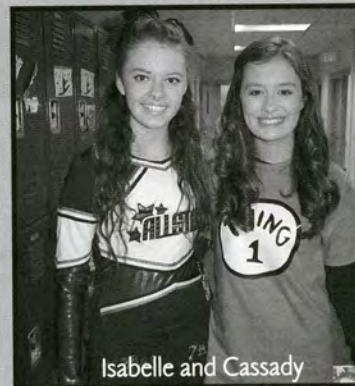

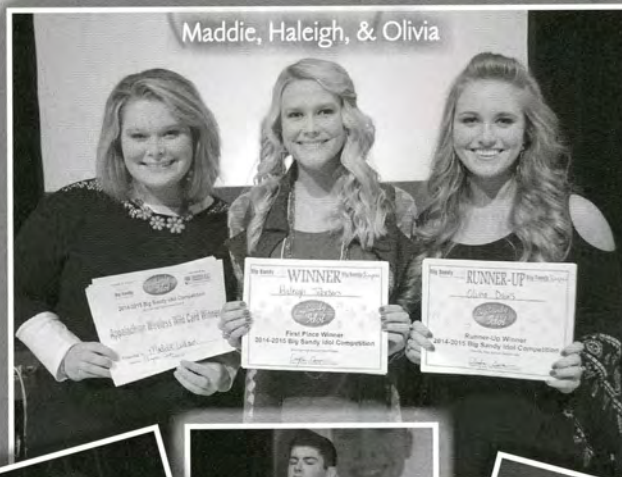
The Big Sandy Idol Competition, presented by Gearheart Communications and Big Sandy Community and Technical College, is in its ninth year.

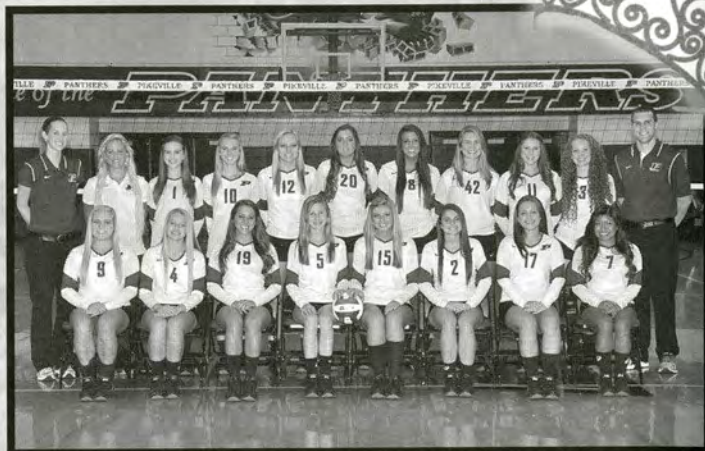
Taunee Justice broke her own record for assists in a season with 1,069 and a career of 3,188. She also garnered 19,483 points in her career.

The Lady Panther Soccer Team completed their season with an impressive 12-9 record. One of their shining moments was capturing the All "A" Regional Championship title.

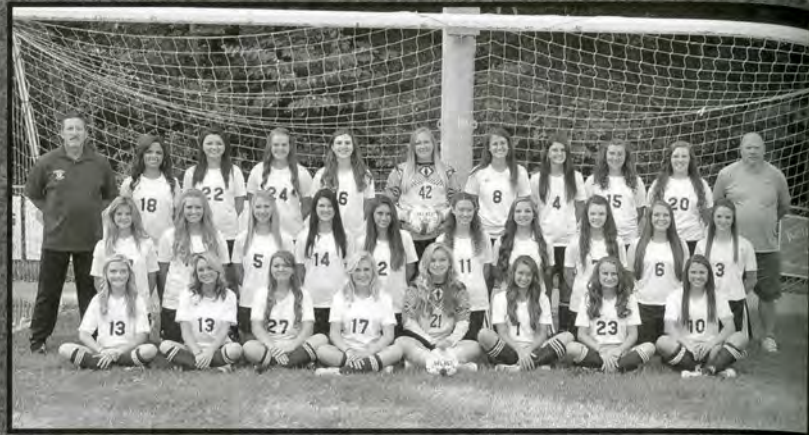

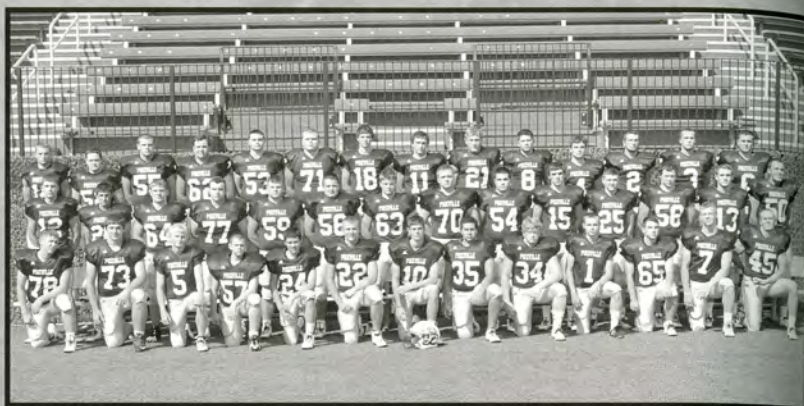
Men in Maroon Make History!

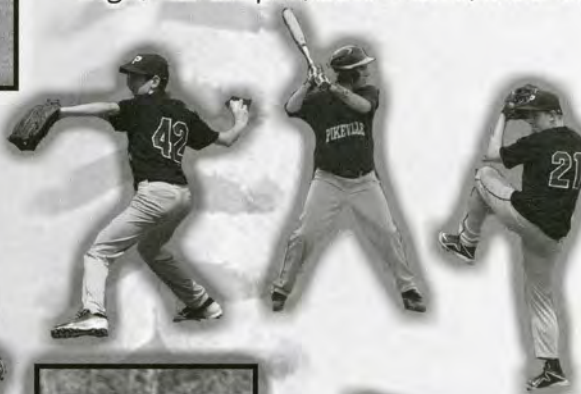
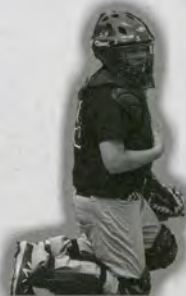
Pike County Middle School Champions
